Some changes in responsibilities have been made, and I will be the Coordinator of the Judicial System for the fall semester. Mr. Jack Begelman will continue to serve as Ombudsman on campus. His office will be located on the 5th floor of Plant Hall. We will also be adding a legal aid advocate office to provide legal information to the students. It will be headed by Krista Miller, a UT student.

'Rats' Invade Campus



"ALWAYS A LINE"

About 850 new students, including 600 freshmen, arrived yesterday for the first day of Orientation Week and the beginning of "Rat" period!

They will be joined Thursday and Friday with the other 1,000 University students enrolled for the fall semester.

University President David M. Delo will address the students, traditionally known as "Rats," at 9 a.m. this morning in Falk Memorial Theatre. There will be a student government convocation immediately afterward.

Registration and testing will fill morning and afternoon hours for freshmen. Registration in alphabetical order begins today and will continue Wednesday. Those not registering will be tested in the Falk Theatre.

Tonight there will be a picnic dinner at the student cen-

ter followed by a pillow and blanket movie. Admission is \$1.

Dr. Harold Grutzmacher, vice president for academic affairs, and Dr. Willis Dunn, director of guidance and placement, head a 10 a.m. convocation Wednesday.

More registration and testing follow.

A computer dance will match couples Wednesday evening in the student center.

New men students will be greeted by Dean of Men Alvin Terry at 10 a.m. in the Falk Theatre. Dean Betty Wiley meets with new women at the same time in the student center dining room.

Dr. and Mrs. Delo will hold a reception for new students from 2-4 p.m. in the student center dining room.

Thursday night's entertainment will be offered by Thee

Place, campus coffeehouse located in the basement of Plant Hall.

Residence hall meetings at 10 a.m. in the dormitories and an 11 a.m. student center discussion of selective service will keep freshmen busy Friday morning.

University alumni Jack and Sally Jenkins will entertain all students Friday night in Falk Theatre.

Saturday night, all students will be invited to a dance in the student center.

Sunday's schedule opens with 2-3 p.m. introductory parties by fraternities in the student center and by sororities in the Plant Hall Ballroom.

An 8 p.m. showing of the Peter Seller's film "A Shot in the Dark" in Falk Theatre closes the week's activities.

Classes begin at 7 a.m. Monday morning.

Phi Delta Theta On Probation

Frat Violates Rush Rules

Phi Delta Theta, the largest and one of the most outstanding fraternities on campus, is on probation for violation of formal rush rules set by the Interfraternity Council (IFC).

The fraternity was placed on probation at a special meeting of the IFC on Tuesday, Aug. 26.

Phi Delta Theta held a party on Monday, Aug. 25 at the fraternity house. According to IFC Vice President Ralph Gonzalez, he and IFC President Jeff White, investigating a rumor, went to the party and found it to be in clear violation of IFC rush rules.

The rules state that no fraternity is

permitted to solicit pledges or hold parties prior to the termination of the formal rush. The rush is a time period set by the individual fraternities which, according to Gonzalez, lasts approximately one month.

Gonzalez said that when he and White arrived at the party, a group of freshmen were entering. The freshmen, he said, had been approached by Phi Delta Theta brothers and were asked to pledge the fraternity.

A representative of Phi Delta Theta admitted to the IFC that rush rule violations occurred. The fraternity president, Larry Baratta made no comment.





Women's Varsity Golf Team To Be Organized

A chance to get in on the ground floor of a brand new program is what awaits University of Tampa women students with the organization of a women's intercollegiate varsity golf team.

UT golf coach Jon Seavey will be in charge of the new team. "I know we have the talent on campus, so we need to form a team," says Seavey. "The weather is ideal and the competition in Florida is very good. What we are looking for are girls, who enjoy playing golf and would like to get involved in a varsity team."

Seavey will hold a meeting for prospective women golfers on Tuesday, September 2 at 10 a.m. in Room 210 of Plant Hall.

Baseball Team Signs Four

The University of Tampa baseball coach Pete Mulry has announced the addition of four players for the 1980-81 season. John Crumbley, Hillsborough Community College, Lee Boyken, Worcester Vocational (Massachusetts) High School, and Scott Dorsey and Steve Dunn, Hudson Catholic (New Jersey) High School have all announced their intentions to play for the Spartans.

Crumbley, a shortstop, played his high school baseball at Leto. He is the fourth member of the HCC squad to join UT. Other ex-HCC stars coming to Tampa are Frank Lopez, Dennis Perrone and Mark Thompson.

Boyken, a catcher/outfielder, was rated by scouts as one of the top prospects in eastern Massachusetts. A versatile athlete, Boyken was also an all-area football player.

High school teammates Dorsey and Dunn were both all-Bergen County selections. Dorsey is a pitcher/third baseman and Dunn is a shortstop/second baseman.

According to Mulry, all four newcomers have a chance to earn spots in the starting lineup. "These are talented young men," Mulry said. "If they work hard in the fall and make the adjustment to college ball, they have the ability to be starters."
