


## Homecoming '78

Our name "The Muezzin" originated in the religion of Islam founded by the prophet Mohammed in the early centuries after Christ and practiced primarily in middle eastern countries. The muezzin is the official who proclaims the azan (call to public worship) to which the Muslims respond with set phrases. The summoning is performed by the voice of the muezzin as he stands at the door or at the side of a small mosque (temple) or in the minaret of a large one. Today the muezzin still sounds the call to worship, but in some modernized mosques his voice is placed upon electronic recordings which are amplified to echo the azan throughout the countryside. The University of Tampa "Muezzin" publication performs a similar function in that it broadcasts the call for higher education among its readers. The name was inspired by Plant Hall's 13 Moorish style minarets, gleaming above trees and buildings as a landmark of learning in the heart of the city of Tampa.

## ALUMNI GIVE

### ADMISSIONS PROGRAM A BOOST

Student applications for the fall semester are on the increase, thanks to a cooperative program between alumni and the University of Tampa admissions office.

When letters announcing the new, \$800,000, four-year scholarship program for high school seniors and transfer students from Hillsborough and Pinellas counties were mailed to alumni recently, Col. Walter Turner, Director of Admissions, enclosed application forms for the fall semester.

You were encouraged to sign the form, then offer it to a qualified student interested in enrolling at UT this fall. The \$20 fee was to be waived.

Turner congratulates alumni and expresses his appreciation--for your interest, for student response.

In a month, 50 applications signed by alumni have been received. Student qualifications are high.

"Many already have been awarded academic scholarships and many more will receive scholarships when their transcripts have arrived," he says.

An additional application form is on the opposite page. If you don't know a qualified student, consult a high school counselor.

Following is some admission information:

- \* Deadline is eight weeks before registration.

- \* Prospective freshmen must submit an official high school transcript and have SAT or ACT scores forwarded to UT.

- \* Transfers must submit college transcripts. If less than 15 hours have been earned, a high school transcript is also required.

- \* Transients must include a letter of transient permission.

Accepted students will receive housing and medical forms. Financial aid forms are available through the UT catalogue or Room 306 in Plant Hall.
