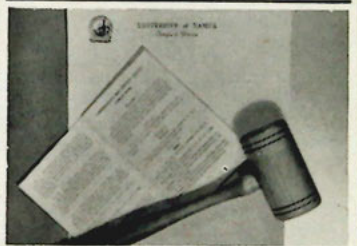

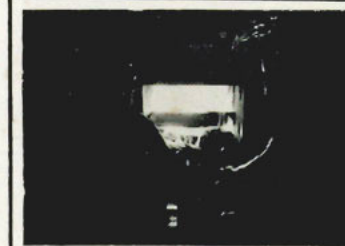

Another sign of progress here at our young and growing University!

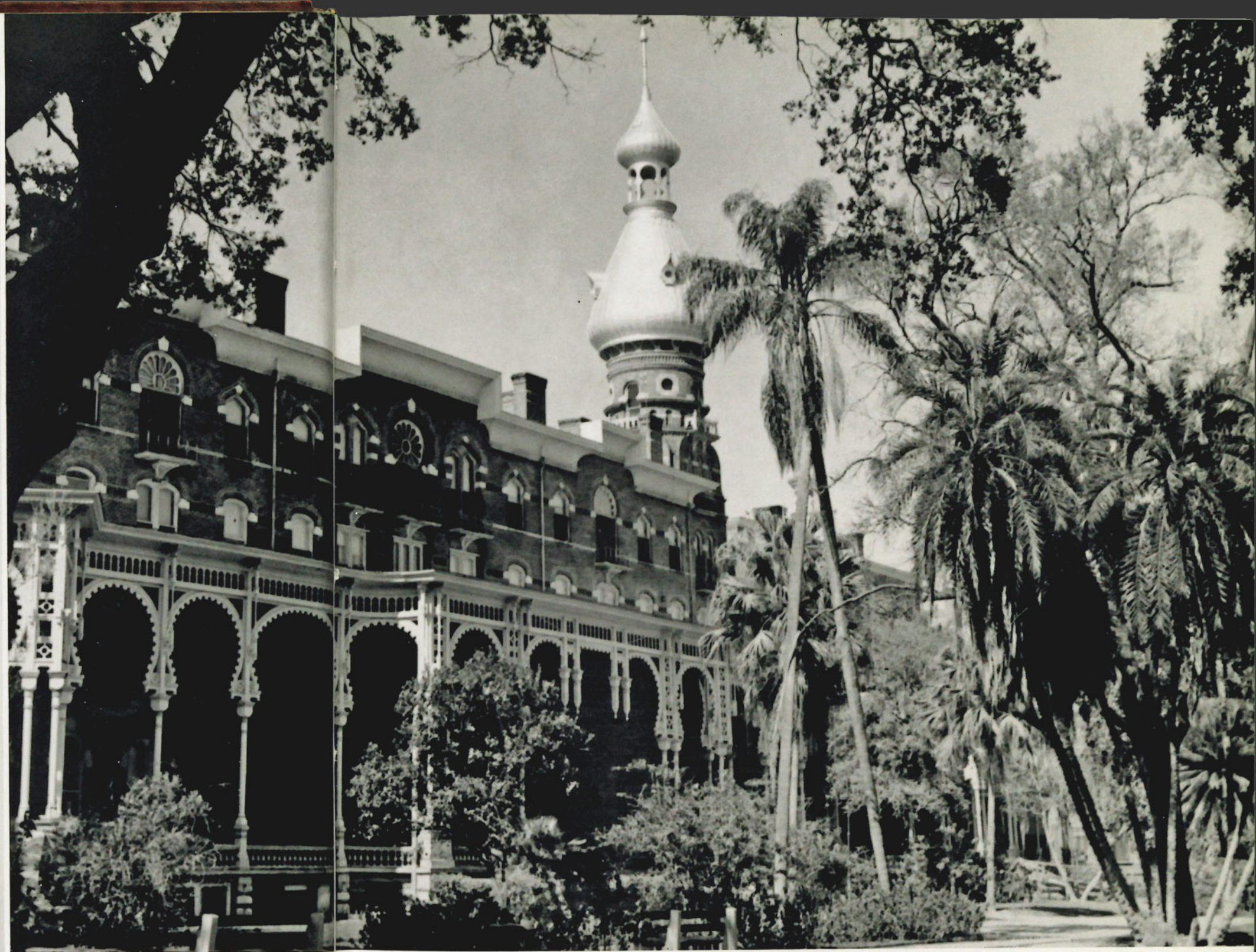


PHILLIPS FIELD . . . home of the University of Tampa Spartan gridgers.

Along with the Board of Trustees, Dr. Nance has continually fought for the development of a University that would be of worth to the City.

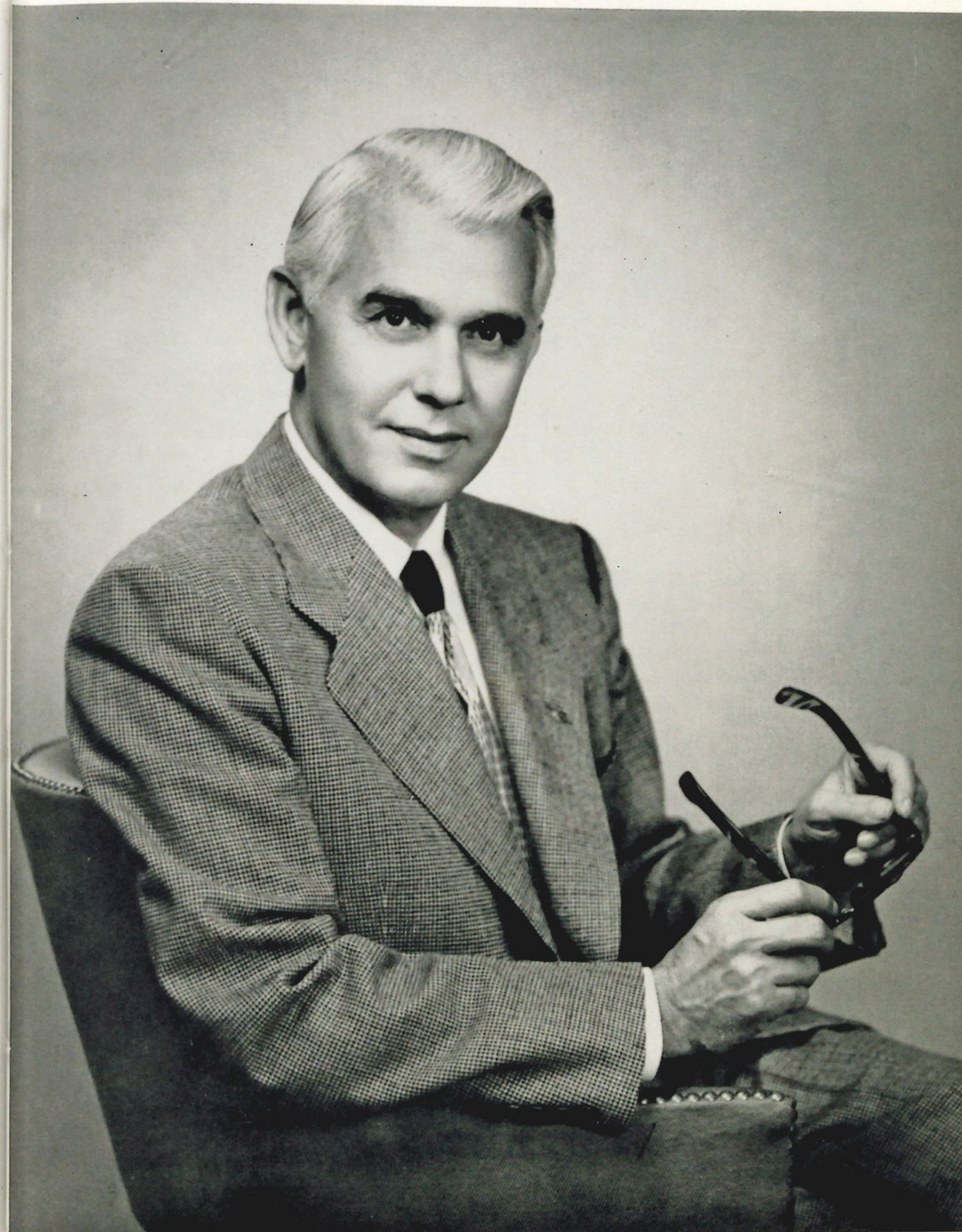

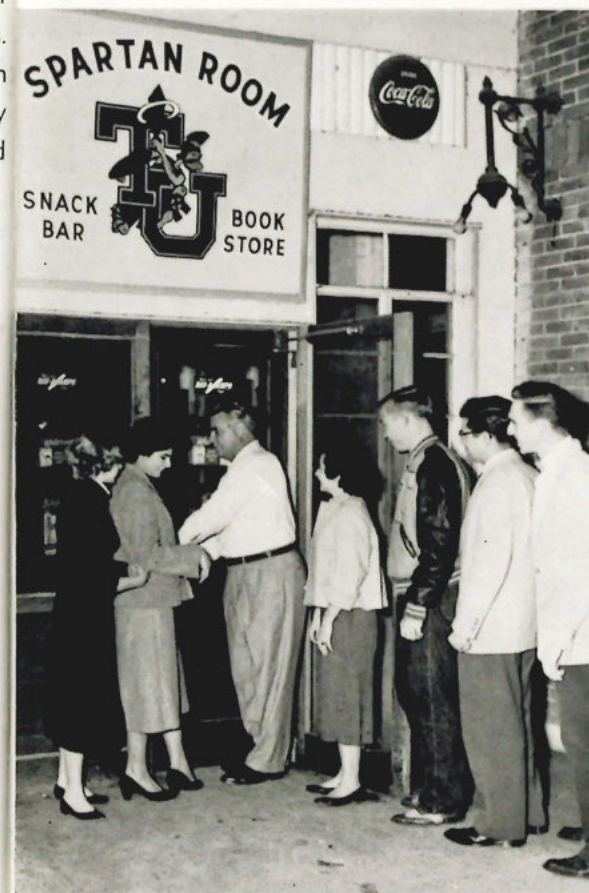

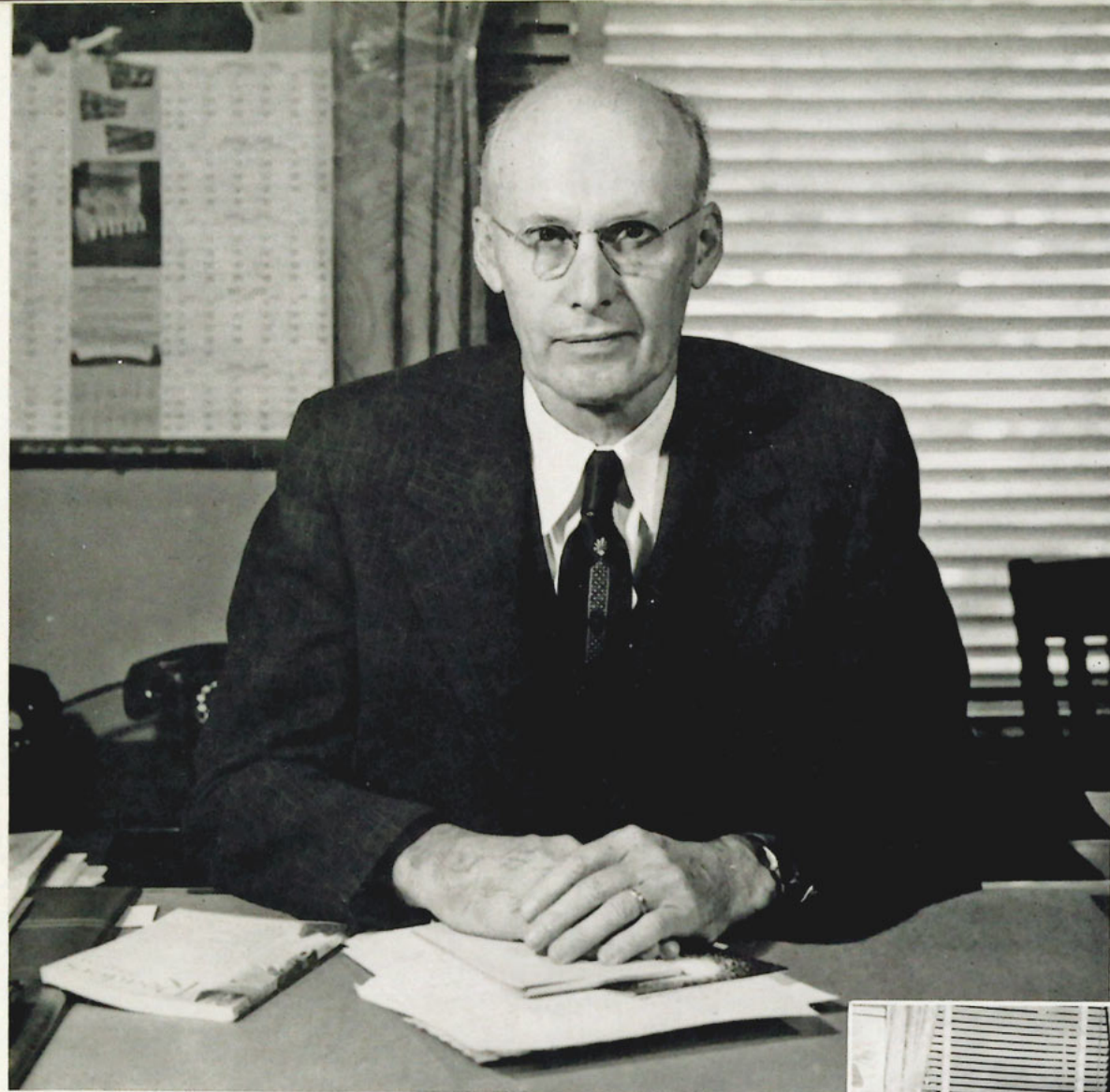

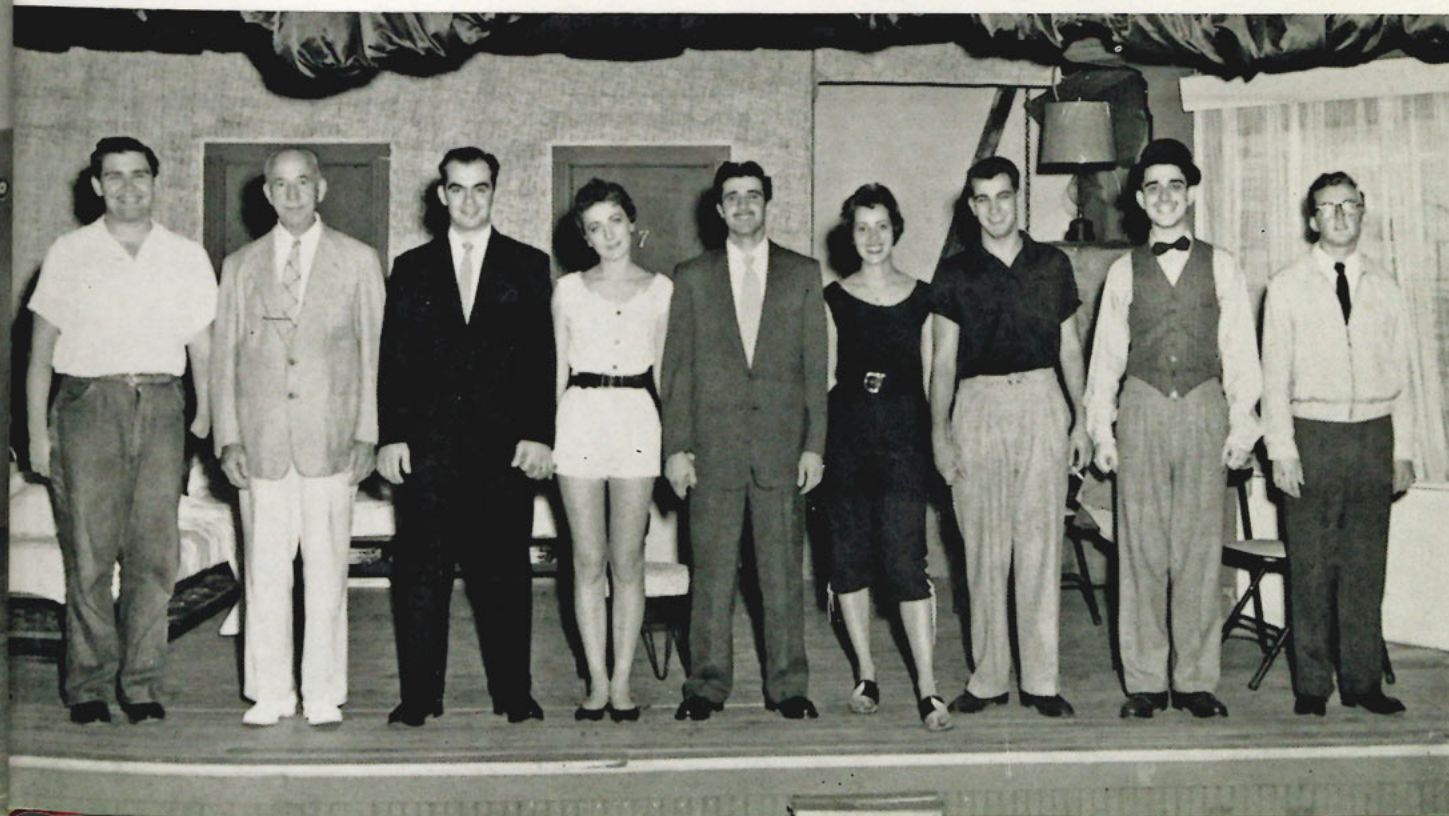

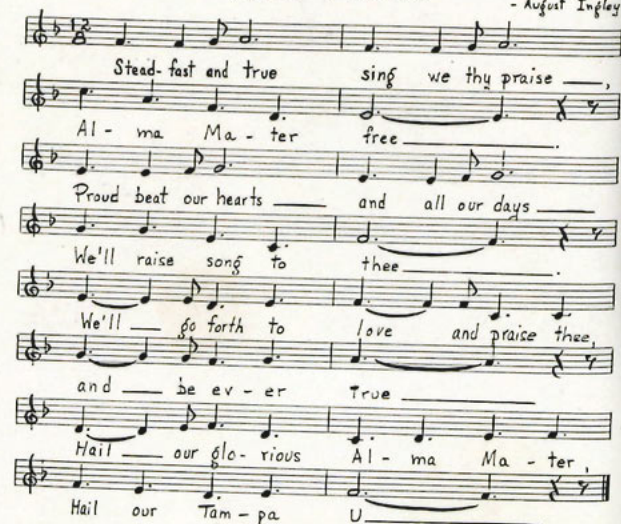

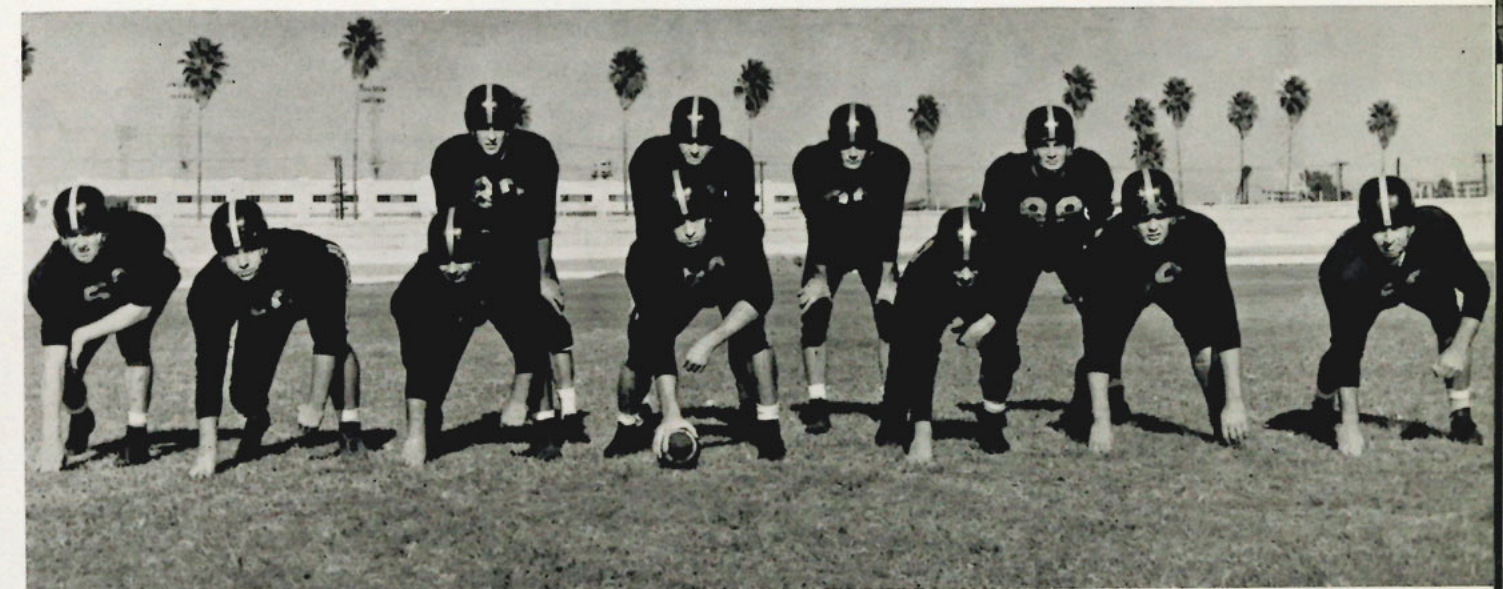

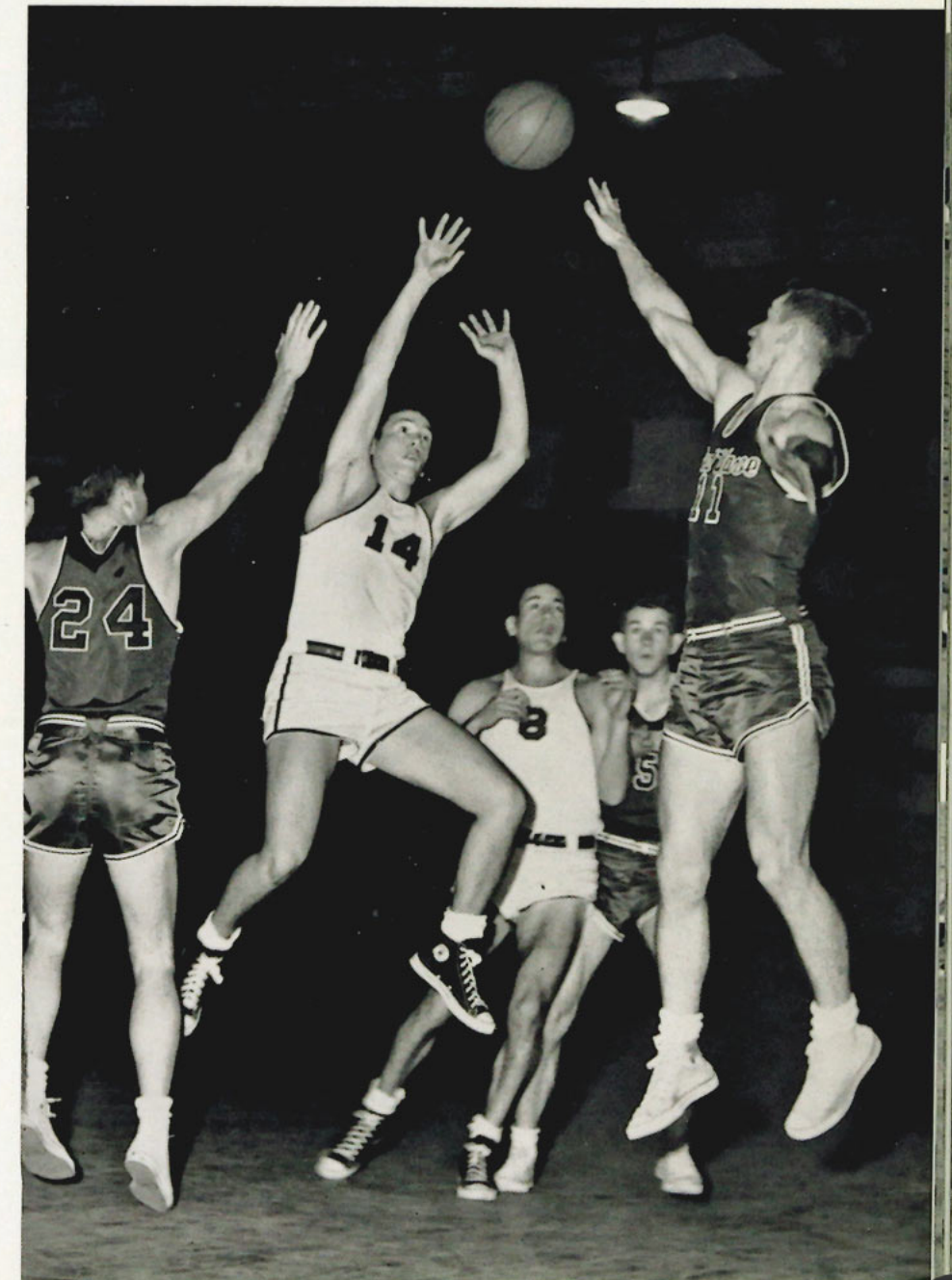

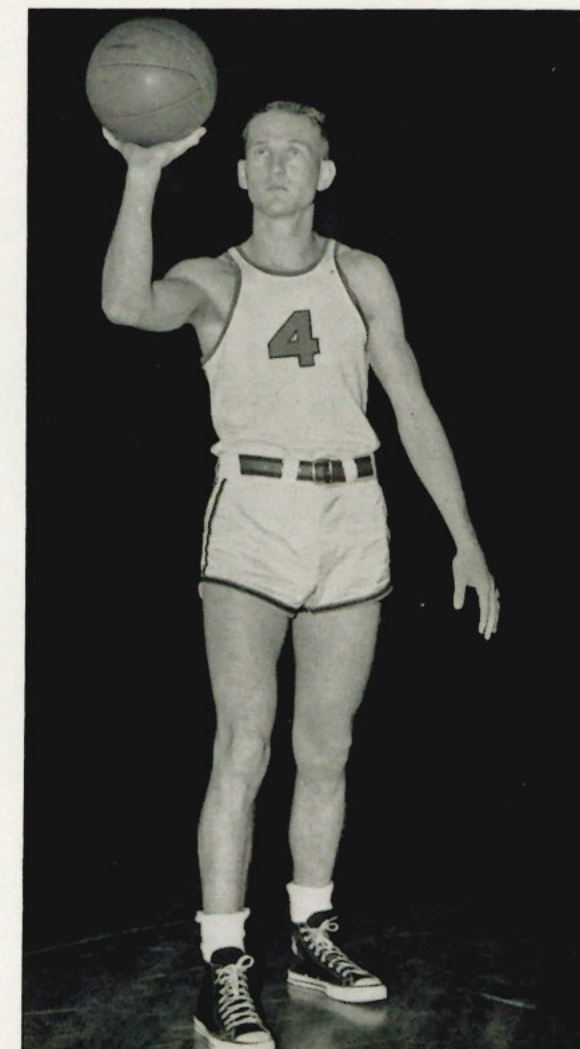

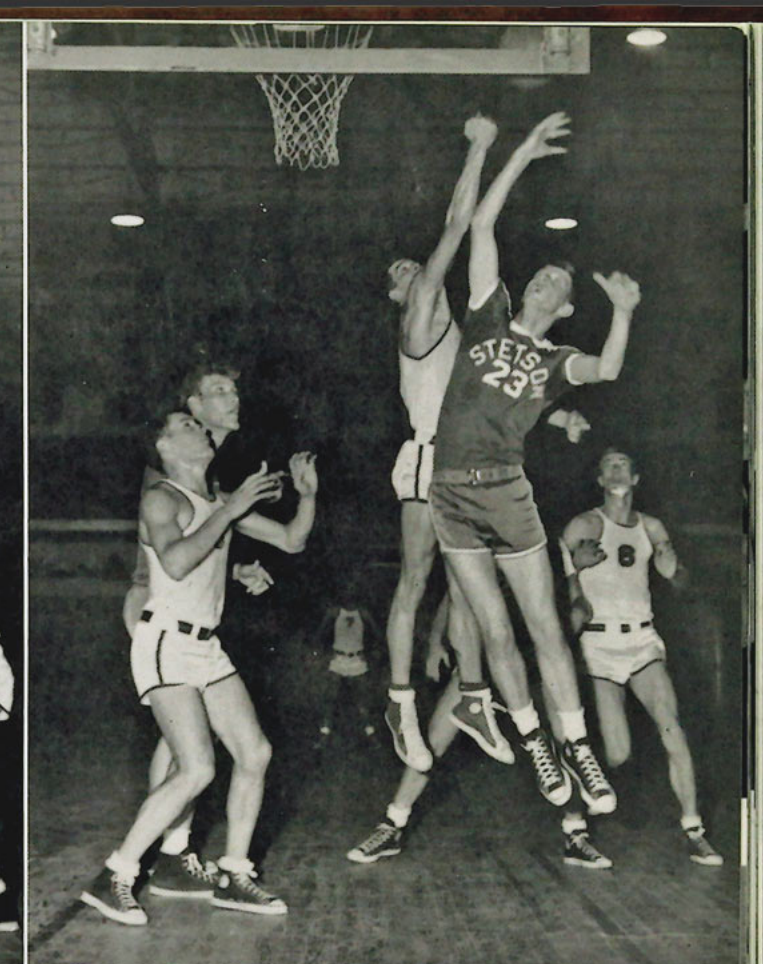

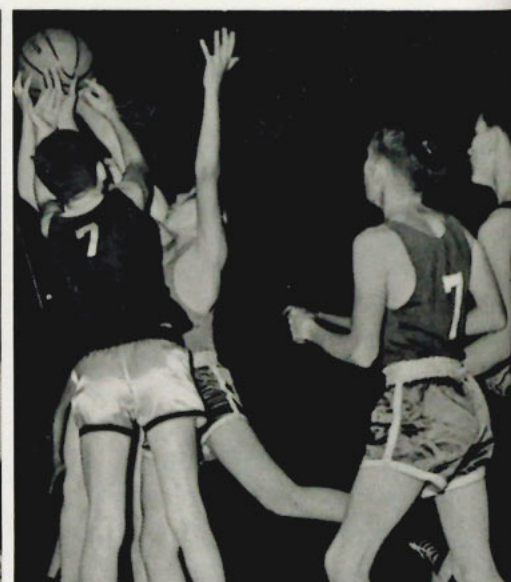

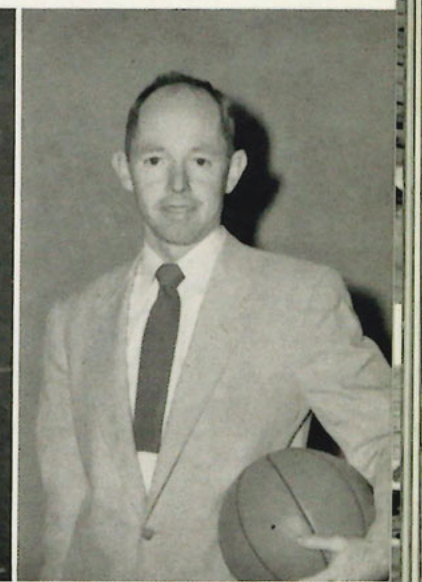

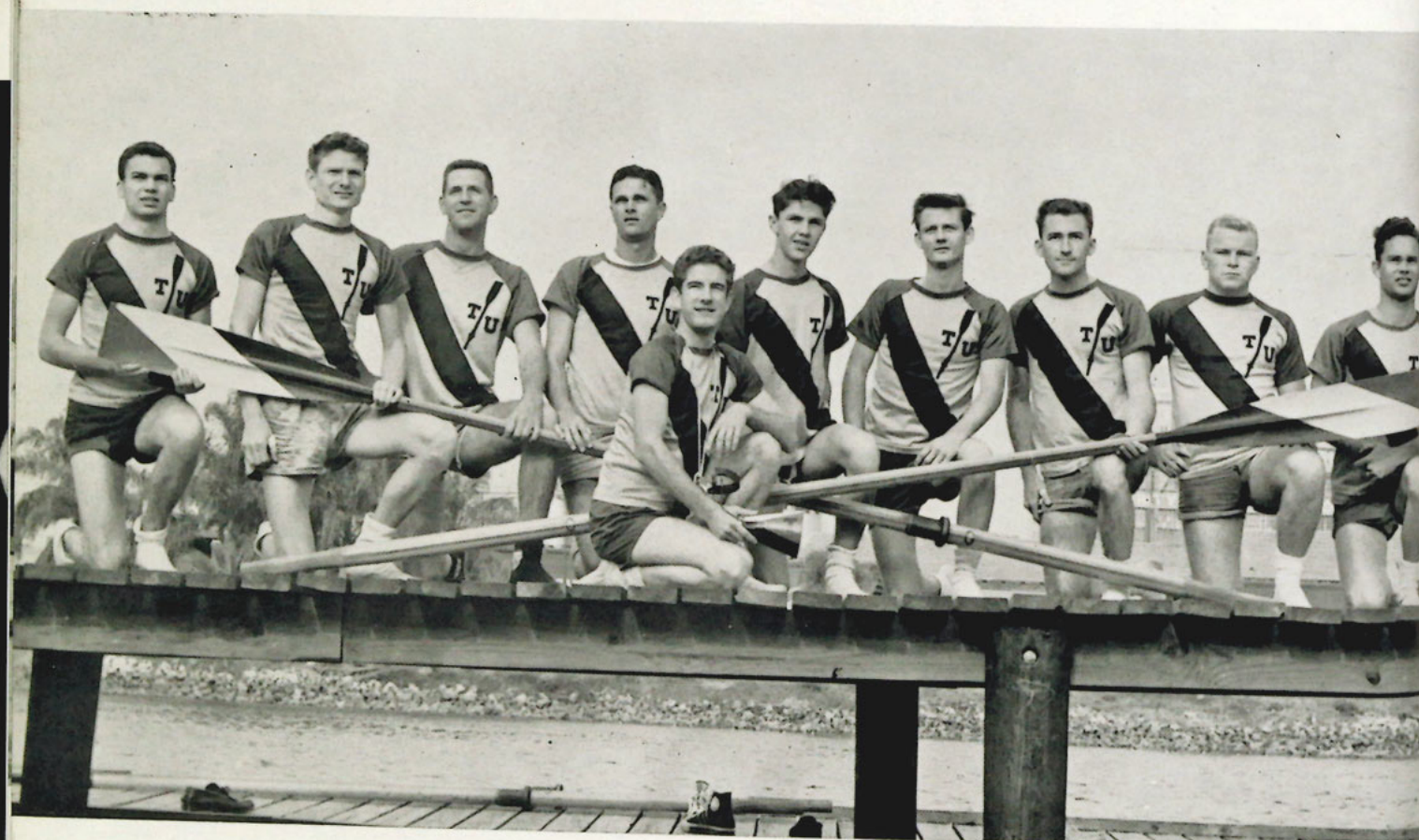

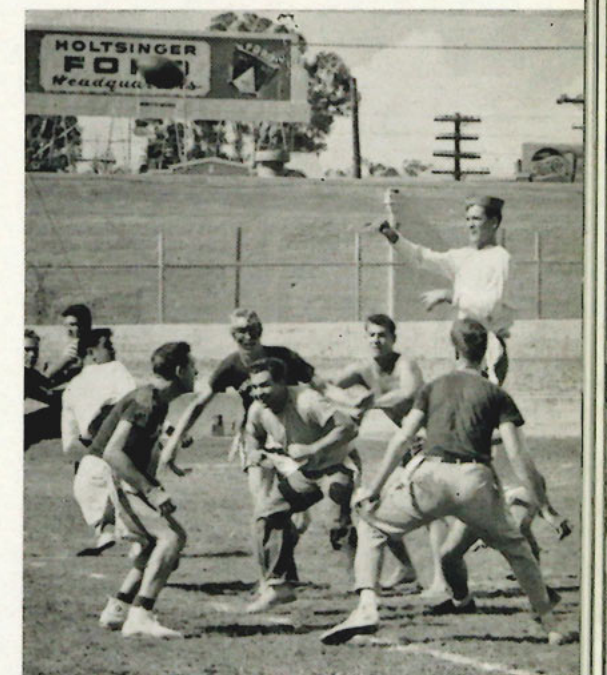

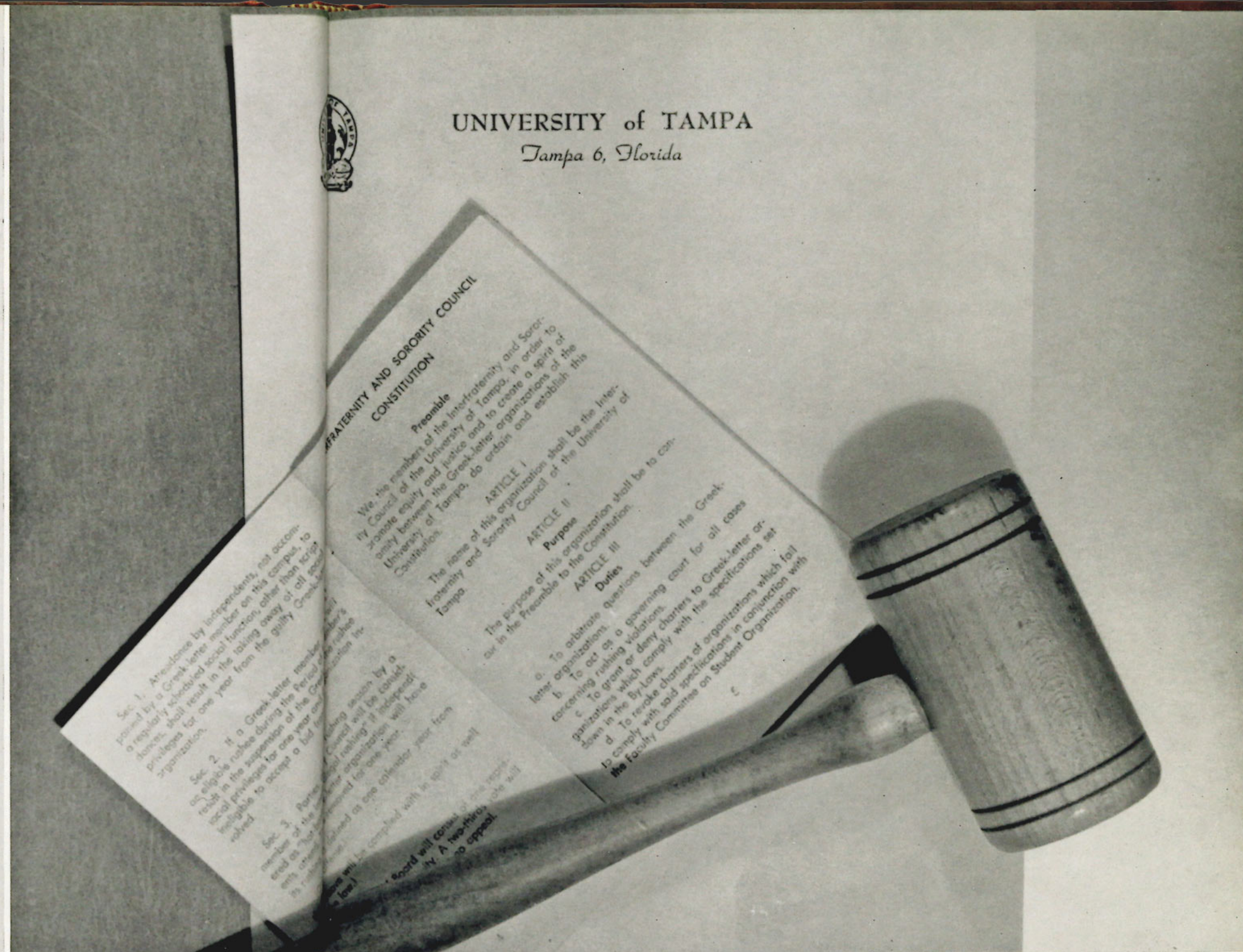




THE UNIVERSITY of Tampa offers to the student, who can qualify, five social fraternities and four sororities.

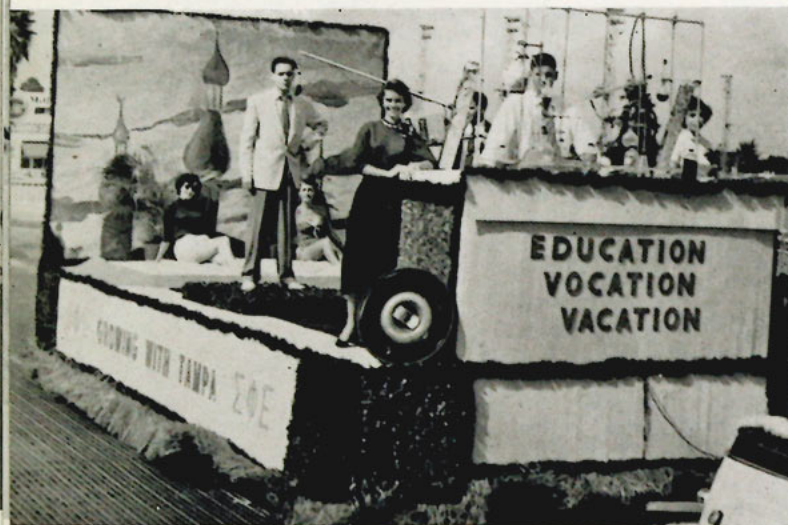

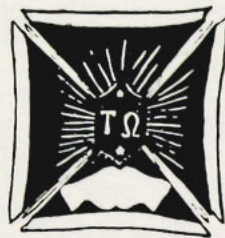

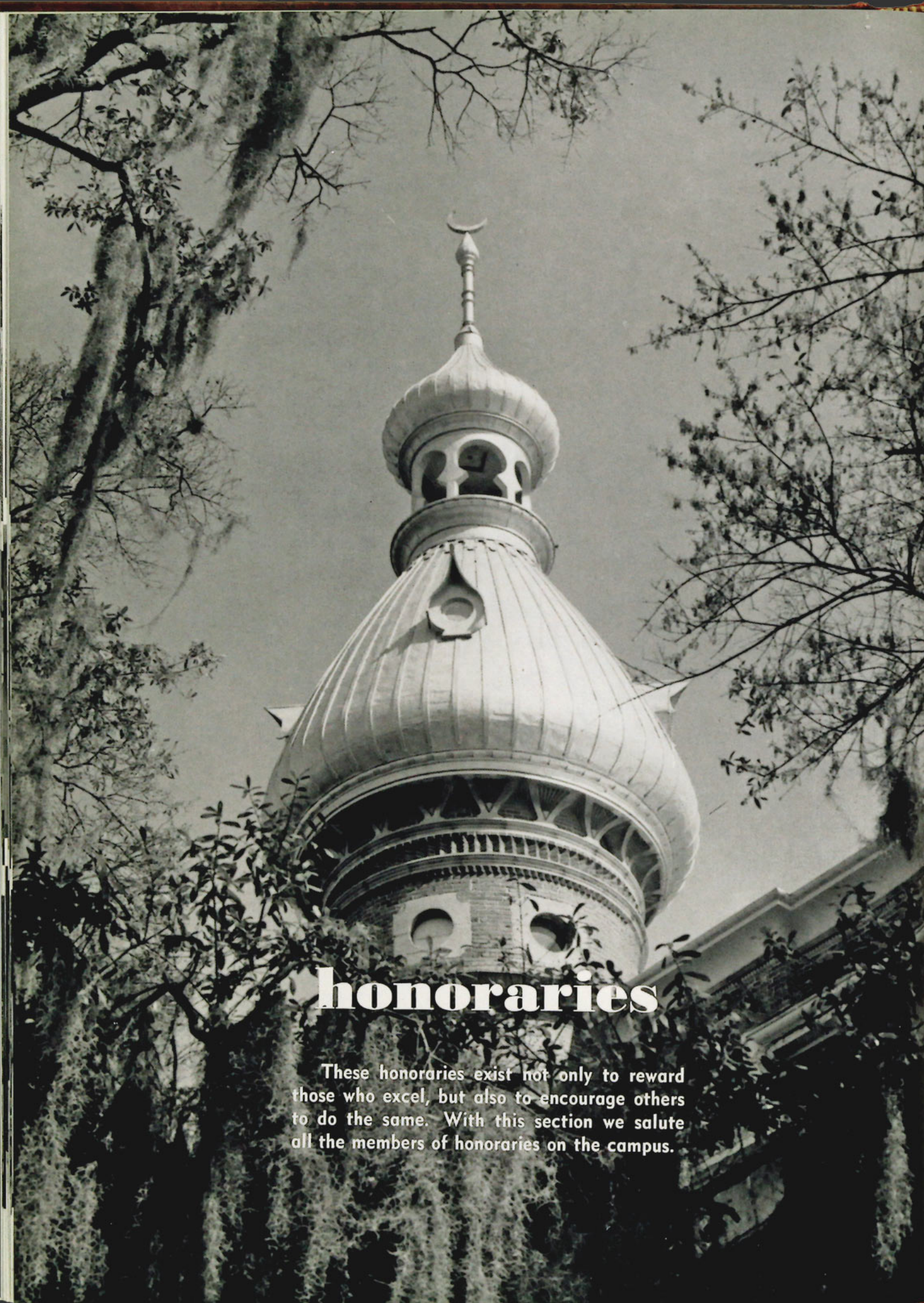

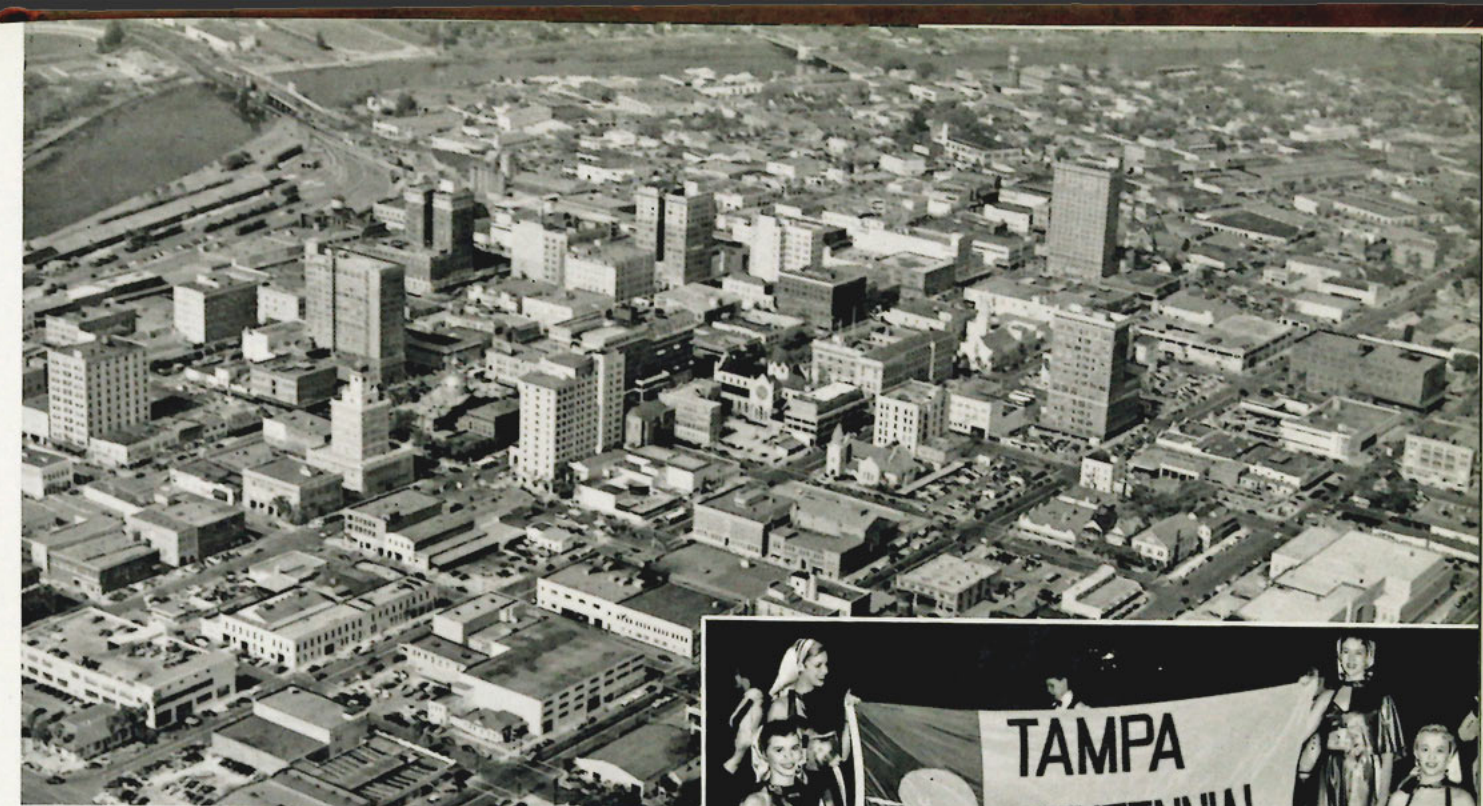
