

Creative Chaos



Perched precariously on one of Plant Hall's minarets is a workman giving it a new coat of paint black paint, that is! The extensive roof and minaret weatherproofing and new aluminum surface project was made possible by a \$75,000 grant from the U.S. Department of Interior's National Park Service under the National Preservation Act of 1966, matched in part by grants from the Conn and Fruehauf Foundations:

From an observer's point of view, the University of Tampa campus this summer looked like sheer chaos. Nothing looked quite right: piles of dirt and broken cement clogged up the parking lot behind Plant Hall; walls were being demolished in the old Fairgrounds buildings; a gaping hole opened up behind the library; amputated pieces of trees were strewn about; and — to top it all (so to speak) — all the minarets were painted black! But by October few traces will be left of the summer

storm. The one-time parking lot now is a pedestrian park with grassy knolls; old Fairgrounds buildings are being transformed into the Scarfone Art Gallery, the new ROTC "Heritage '76 Building," and new industrial arts and fine arts facilities; the gaping hole is now a sparkling new swimming pool; the trees are neatly groomed for the Bicentennial year; and — to everyone's relief — the minarets are once again elegantly silver.

A Match Anyone?

With the dollar shrinking in value almost daily it astounds many to hear that there are ways to make gifts to the University of Tampa which double in value and impact. It occurs because grants or gifts are occasionally made on a challenge or matching basis, i.e., that the donor encourages others to support the project by matching gifts to it.

For example, the University received a \$75,000 matching gift from the National Park Service for the much-needed roof and minaret restoration project on Plant Hall, the historic Tampa Bay Hotel building. This large and essential project will cost, on a bid basis. \$150,000 and will safeguard the entire building including the restored Western Civilization Corridor rooms. This means that each gift you make for the roof project will be matched \$1 for 1 - a good way to double the impact of your gift dollars. At press time., \$35,000 of the needed \$75,000 has been pledged. Your help is needed to complete the project and to preserve Tampa's most famous landmark.

Another interesting match and challenge was made by an anonymous Tampa donor who gave \$3,000 toward construction of a hand-made harpsichord for the Music Department to be placed in Fletcher Lounge. This donor specified he would match gifts on the basis of a \$1 for every \$2 given by others so that the \$9,000 project might become a reality in time for a series of Bicentennial concerts in 1976. Friends of the music program at the University are invited to extend the value of their gift dollars by helping to complete this match.
