FOUR YEAR PROGRESS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF TAMPA

Four years ago the University of Tampa had an enrollment of only 200 students. This past year over 1300 students were enrolled and this fall semester will see approximately the same number taking courses at the University. The progress of the past four years is evidenced by not only the increase in enrollment but by the overall growth of the institution. The faculty in 1945 numbered twenty-one professors. This year the faculty will number fifty and the staff will have increased from six to thirty-six members. In this period of time, 303 students have received degrees, and this number totals more than all previous graduating classes.

The budget for the operation of the University has increased from approximately \$80,000 to \$300,000 and all faculty members have received raises totaling \$1,050 in the past four years.

Three new buildings have been erected on the campus, and general improvements have been made throughout the 500 rooms of the original building. New equipment and property have been added, making a total of over a million dollars in property and endowment received in the past four years.

According to Dr. Doak S. Campbell, president of Florida State University, in his message to the Summer graduates here, the University of Tampa is on sound footing academically, financially, and otherwise, and it should soon be recognized by the Southern Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools.

#### 1949-50 SPARTAN FOOTBALL SQUAD
