## Crew Team Off For Philadelphia;

## Takes Second In State Title Race

crew team, with a prestige
victory under its belt after victory under its belt after
placing second well ahead of Florida Southern in the Florida State Rowing Regatta last Saturday, is off to Philadelphi and the Rad Vail Regatta
Rollins took the state championship, but was hardpushed by Tampa all the way. Tampa took the lead and held it until halfway when Rollins moved up slowly. A last quarter sprint by Rollins was the deciding factor as Tampa was unable to match the in-
creased stroke and crossed the finish line a length and a half back.
Rollins, which won the title for the fourth straight year, pulled the mile and five-sixtenths distance in six minutes, 49 seconds. Tampa's time was $7: 00.6$. Southern, three length behind Tampa, was not recorded.

Rollins also won the junior varsity championship - its
first in the nine-year history of the event. Rollings crosse the finish line two lengths ahead of Southern in seven en, two lengths back, finished n seven minutes 13 , seconds Tampa, the defending champion, was four lengths behind Southern.
Tampa pointed for Southern in the state race, having been beaten twice by the Lakeland eam.
