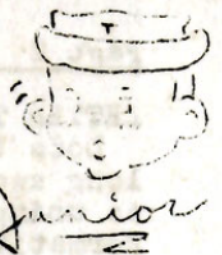

Everyone is welcomed to the Open House to be held in the Girls Dorm, Friday, from 1 P. M. till 2 P. M.

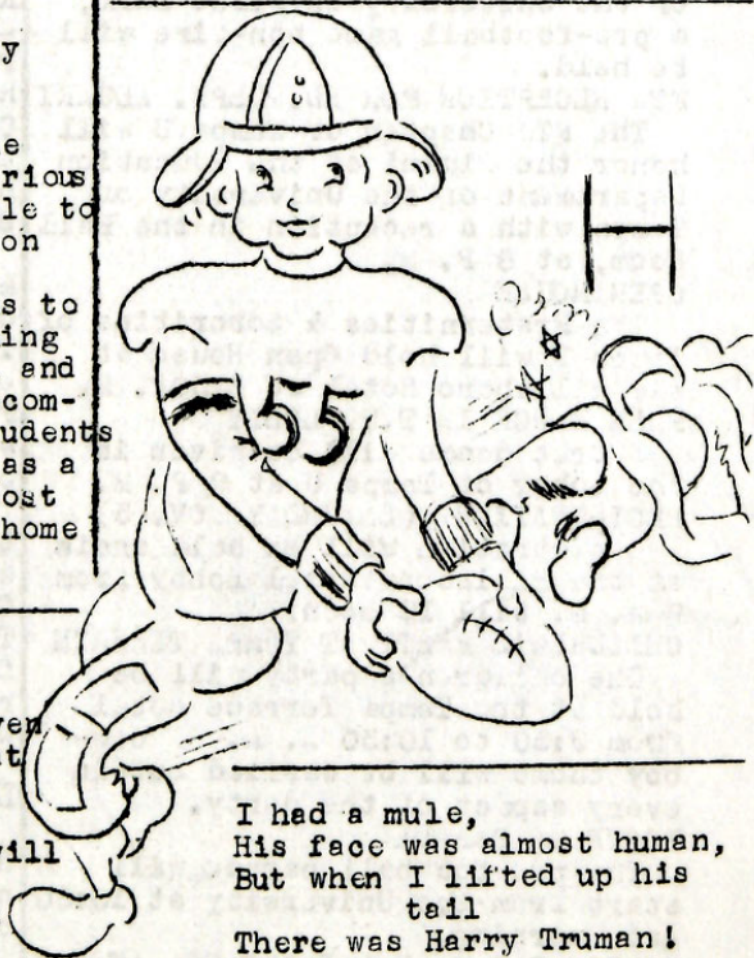
HOMECOMING DANCE
