A sub-committee of the student council is drawing up a constitution which will be presented to the student body for ratification in the near future.

In regard to cutting: No student making a grade of C, or below, for the preceding? No student making a grade of C, or below, for the preceding grade period is entitled to cut his class for any reason except illness, unless he has previously notified and received permission from his instructor to cut at that particular time. By an agreement the student council has reached with Dean Coulson, a student doing B work may cut his class for any sufficient reason provided that the reason is satisfactory to the instructor. If the instructor does not find the reason satisfactory the student is liable to a penalty. An A grade for the preceding period entitles the student to cut when he sees fit without drawing any penalty; this exemption from penalty, however, endures only so long as the student makes up the work he has missed within a reasonable length of time.

Students with grades of C, or below, may be excluded from the final eximination in any course in which they have an excess of three cuts.
