




President's Report 1978-79

The University of Tampa Muezzin (USPS 077840) is published quarterly by the University of Tampa, 401 West Kennedy Boulevard, Tampa, Florida, 33606, with issues in Winter, Spring, Summer and Fall. Our name "The Muezzin" originated in the religion of Islam founded by the prophet Mohammed in the early centuries after Christ and practiced primarily in middle eastern countries. The muezzin is the official who proclaims the azan (call to public worship) to which the Muslims respond with set phrases. The summoning is performed by the voice of the muezzin as he stands at the door or at the side of a small mosque (temple) or in the minaret of a large one. Today the muezzin still sounds the call to worship, but in some modernized mosques his voice is placed upon electronic recordings which are amplified to echo the azan throughout the countryside. The University of Tampa "Muezzin" publication performs a similar function in that it broadcasts the call for higher education among its readers. The name was inspired by Plant Hall's 13 Moorish style minarets, gleaming above trees and buildings as a landmark of learning in the heart of the city



Dear Colleagues and Friends:

A new academic partnership is beginning to take form at the University of Tampa. It is my view, as proposed in the inaugural address a year ago, that "the idea of partnership in the academic enterprise has many dimensions, but three of significance: management, or how we make policy decisions; learning, and how we teach to produce knowledge; and service, or how we relate to the world at large and metropolitan Tampa Bay in particular."


Management Partnership

The academic year 1978-79 was the first year of our new management partnership, in which the Board of Trustees, Collegium (University Senate), faculty, and staff reorganized their policy-making process in order to share more readily the responsibility for important decisions. This has had the effect of tapping into a wider pool of talent and a wider range of views, which has made this campus a livelier and more vital place. Major decisions are more controversial and more difficult to make, but are ultimately more informed and more intelligent.

Leadership of the Board of Trustees is exercised by a chairman and vice-chairman, and by the chairmen of councils on education, business, and public affairs. During 1978-79, these posts were held with distinction respectively by Robert Thomas, Harris Mullen, J. Thomas Touchton, H.L. Culbreath, and J. H. Williams; with new leadership in place at the end of this period in the service of Robert Thomas, J. Thomas Touchton, Louis de la Parte, Jr., Jim Ferman, Jr., and David C. G. Kerr.

Special joint committees were created to deal with matters related to Tampa Preparatory School (located on the UT campus), headed by Professor Theodore Jennings; continuing education, chaired by Professor Stanton Truxillo; campus freedom and responsibility, led by Fellow James Talley; academic calendar, chaired by Professor Robert Harder; and curriculum, headed by Professor Mary Jane Schenck. Each produced in-depth reports and valuable recommendations for the guidance of University policy makers. In addition, the University of Tampa Improvement Foundation was revitalized under the leadership of Fischer Black, Fred Learey, and Edmund Sliz to assist with off-campus property development.

Senior administrative appointments brought to campus Rudolph Koletic, as vice president for business affairs, and John Telfer, as secretary of the university, and promoted Mark Lono to vice president for public affairs. I am very grateful to Edmund Sliz, who retired after seventeen years of exemplary service as business vice president; to Jack Munyan, who served briefly in that chair as acting vice



president and is now associate professor of business management; and to Fred Learey, who served through much of the year on an interim basis at the vice presidential level in two different assignments as the University prepared for permanent new appointments.


In June, Michael Mendelsohn, provost of the University, announced his retirement from administrative duties in order to return to full-time teaching, which he will do as professor of English, effective January 1, 1980. I am indebted to him for his advice and assistance the past two years and for his administrative service to the University the past seven years.

The University's management structure is not only new to this university, but is, so far as we know, unique in this country. It is more demanding of effort, and yet, we believe, more rewarding of result. It bears a few words of explanation.

The University is organized three-dimensionally in both creating and carrying out policy. Policy is formulated at three levels: goals and objectives by the Board of Trustees; program design by the Collegium (consisting of eleven faculty, six students, and four senior administrators); and working practice by faculty, staff, and students in their areas of particular concern and competence.

Policy is *implemented* in three functional areas of education, business affairs (or administrative services), and public affairs (promotion and support); and the Board, the Collegium, and the administrative staff are organized in corresponding three-part units to reflect that. The parallel structures enable more direct and comprehensive communication among counterparts on campus and off, and generate more effective decisions.

During 1978-79, the University undertook the first of a new five-year rotating cycle of operational evaluations. An eight-member team of outstanding volunteer consultants, headed by Trustee Jim Ferman, Jr., spent the year observing the University's financial management, buildings and grounds operations, administrative support, personnel practice, security provisions, legal arrangements, and computer services. The team's recommendations have formed a basis for stronger institutional management in a time when efficient use of resources is more necessary than ever




Learning Partnership

1978-79 was a year of definition for our all-important learning partnership intended to focus on the day-to-day working relationships of faculty and students in course. This took form at three levels: an institutional mission, an educational policy, and an academic calendar.

Inspired by "belief in God, respect for human dignity, and love of freedom," the Trustees committed the University to "helping each student develop a personal integration of intellectual, moral, and practical knowledge" against a standard of "excellence in all its programs." I interpret this to be an affirmation that the pursuit of truth in knowing, being, and doing is — for each member of this university — the life-giving spirit of our work together. This is the philosophical base for the University as an institution of higher learning.

In its response to Trustee adoption of this new University mission statement, the Collegium acknowledged that "the core of the teaching-learning process... is the interaction of professor and student in a cooperative or partnership approach to learning." It recognized both the necessity and willingness of students "to work hard at their studies," and it asserted that "motivation, involvement, and work can be promoted by rigorous standards, intensive pace, concentration of effort, and imaginative pedagogic style." These, it inferred, ought to be the hallmark of this University's manner of teaching and study.

In seeking ways to translate this policy into practice, many of us found that faculty and student time were not organized to allow for the enriched, multi-dimensional coursework we were trying for. Therefore, throughout the year, a considerable degree of effort was invested in exploration of alternative academic calendars (yearly, seasonal, weekly, and daily schedules of work) which might best enhance the University's educational objectives.




Though there was initially no agreement on precisely which form of calendar might best serve the interests of the University, there seemed to be widespread agreement that different calendars (semesters, quarters, or shorter modular terms) do make a difference in the pace and quality of academic work. As the year drew to a close, a Special Committee on Calendar began a summer-long exploration of alternatives. It subsequently unanimously recommended an innovative Bimester Plan, in which students typically study two courses at a time, meeting two hours daily for two months each, and leading to greater concentration, continuity, and contact for students in each course. After considerable campus debate, the Committee's recommendation received the unanimous approval of the Board of Trustees in a landmark decision on October 18.

Because of its special features promoting greater flexibility, as well as intensity and individuality of study, the new Bimester Plan represents an exceptionally promising new vision of the way teaching and learning ought to work. In addition, its pioneering approach helps put this University in a potentially more visible posture in the academic world that can be an important benefit to us all.

A mission, policy, and calendar discussions have gone for ward, the University has accelerated its enforcement of higher standards. For admission to UT, new minimum predicted college grade point agerage (based on high school performance and test scores) was established at 2.0, with few exceptions made. Three times more applications for admission were rejected than last year. College students transferring to UT no longer received credit for "D" grades from their other colleges. Progressive grade point average minimums to stay in school were strictly enforced, and nearly twice as many students (137) were dismissed for academic reasons than the year before (72). In 1979, it was harder to get in and harder to stay in this University than it was in any previous year.

In the course of our academic pursuits during early 1979, several separate and controversial incidents regarding discussion of human sexuality and black nationalism became matters of campus concern. They prompted appointment of a special committee, which found "no contradiction between academic freedom and academic responsibility," and which encouraged "the intellectual stimulation which comes from the expression of varying points of view," as well as pursuit of such "with dignity and purpose, with excellence and discipline, in service to humanity."







Service Partnership

The University's service partnership, especially as it relates to our home city and metropolitan area, continues to be a matter of urgent attention. The second year of our new merit-based academic scholarships brought in 97 new scholarship students from the Tampa Bay Area (up from 82 last year). These students have brought noticeable new vitality to classroom and campus, and reflect a gradual transformation of our student profile. There have always been good and successful students at UT, but now there are more than ever.

The University last year (and again this year) has made a new commitment to participation of its members in the life of the community. A joint effort of students, faculty, and staff caused UT to exceed its United Way goal. Faculty and staff members were active on each of the working councils of the Chamber of Commerce, Individuals were involved on boards and committees and staffs of a wide variety of civic, cultural, church, and recreational organizations throughout the city and metropolitan area.

New efforts were undertaken to persuade undergraduates from all over the country and the world, as well as from Hillsborough County, that Tampa is a good place to build their futures. Members of the Board of Counselors served as community representatives assigned to assist new students, as well as new graduates, interested in Tampa Bay Area career opportunities. As Tampa increasingly develops into a gateway of opportunity for people across the country, this University must increasingly serve as a source of good, creative talent for the Tampa Bay Area.

Promotion and Support

In the areas of promotion and support, the University enjoyed an excellent year. Student recruitment efforts in 1978-79 helped cause applications for 1979-80 to be up 32 percent (to 3,090) for 800 places in the new class — our best recruiting year ever — and the new class is the best academically qualified ever to enroll at UT.

The 1978 Forward Fund exceeded its goal by raising \$801,774.00 (up 116 percent over 1977), which made 1978 by far the best fund raising year ever. This spectacular Forward Fund result enabled the University to begin financing the five percent gift portion of its operating budget in the year prior to the year in which the funds are actually used, thus introducing a new measure of fiscal soundness into University operations.

Major new gifts from the families of Israel Kessler, Dorothy Thomas, and Doyle and Nell Carlton enabled the University to establish scholarship funds for outstanding students. But the higher academic standards, applied both in the admission of new students and the retention of continuing students, has caused some degree of strain on the operating budget, which is 90 percent dependent on student fees. Fall 1979 undergraduate enrollment (at 1,637) was the equivalent of 54 full-time students less than planned — the direct result of tougher cut-offs — which had the effect of reducing numbers. The total number of different students at UT in 1978-79 — full-time, part-time and special — was 2,947.


The drop in enrollment should be a temporary phenomenon as academically less able students are replaced by those attracted to UT through the new scholarship and Bimester Plan, as well as those who elect to stay because of the maturing academic atmosphere on campus. Furthermore, Florida's new state-wide tuition voucher plan for private-college-bound, two-year resident graduates of high schools in the state (which provided grants of \$750 per student to 1979 freshmen and \$1,000 for 1980 freshmen and sophomores) promises great new incentives for Florida high school graduates to attend UT and other in-state private colleges.

To the degree that academic excellence is defined by the quality of students and graduates — and I believe that is substantial — the University of Tampa is pursuing a course which is shaping a distinct and proud academic identity based on solid performance. It is the route this University has a firm mandate to travel in the 1980's, as we begin our second half century of service to our city, our nation, and our friends around the world.






Fall Celebration '79 Homecoming, Parents Weekend & Oktoberfest
