Candidates Approved

Four o'clock last Wednesday afternoon found the Dean's offices frantically putting the stamp of approval on the last candidate's petition. There are twenty-nine candidates up for office, with only one running unopposed, and all had to comply with new regulations, as established in the new constitution. In order to qualify each of the candidates had to be full semester hours this semester and time undergraduate students who have completed at least 12 credit hours in the University in each of the last two preceding semesters with a minimum of a 1.0 average in the preceding semester. They also have to be carrying at least 12 have an overall 1.0 average.

The provisions of the new constitution call for a reduction of officers, but in place of the single legislative body which we are now working under there will be a two house system with the members of the House of Representatives to be elected at a later date. The upper house will contain both the executive and legislative offices, including Student Body President, Student Body Vice President, and the newly created position of Student Body Co-ed Vice President. In addition to the student body offices there will also be seven class offices, namely Senior Class President, Senior Class Vice President, Senior Class Secretary, Junior Class President, Junior Class Vice President, Sophomore Class President and Sophomore Class Vice President.

Yvette Forman seems to be the only candidate, at present, who can safely say she has an office for sure. The young lady is running unopposed for Senior Class Secretary.




