




## Covington Named NASA Historian

Dr. James Covington, professor of history, has been named senior historian for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration's Apollo Launch Project at the Kennedy Space Center.

## Forward Fund Exceeds 1967 Campaign Goal

Under the leadership of Chairman Gen. Paul D. Adams, the 1967 Forward Fund goal has been exceeded by \$3,803.99.

By the end of the year, \$203,798.99 had been raised surpassing the stated goal of \$199,995, according to General Adams.

The Forward Fund was established in 1964, to enable the University to bridge the deficiency between normal income and necessary expenditures. Friends of the University conduct the campaign each year.

## Brick Residence Given To College

A colonial-styled brick home valued at \$135,000 has been presented to the University by Mr. and Mrs. William J. Barritt Jr. of Tampa.

The 11-room house will be used for a president's home, according to Dr. David M. Delo, president.

The 44-year-old residence sits on a 2 1/2-acre site at 3108 Prospect Road. It is the largest single gift the University has ever received, Dr. Delo said.

Barritt, a counselor at the University, is the retired chairman of the board of the southeastern district of the Borden Co.

## Greetings from the President



It is the fashion these days for many authors to rush into print with pre-obituary statements for independent higher education. Only a few weeks ago Alan Pifer, president of the Carnegie Corp. of New York, speaking at the annual meeting of the Association of American Colleges stated, "There appears to be a kind of consensus developing that the financial needs of our colleges and universities are now so desperate that nothing will save them except major amounts of additional dollars from Uncle Sam." Then he added, "We are forced therefore to a very simple conclusion. If this Nation's needs for higher education are to be met in the years to come, the Federal Government will have to accept the principal part of the consequent financial burden."

These proposals obviously endanger the educational free enterprise system which the University of Tampa represents. Yet it is all too true that many private institutions are in trouble. Operating budgets are increasing nationally at an average annual rate of 14 percent. Ours has been growing even more rapidly. Thus some educational forecasters now prophesy that as many as 250 independent colleges will either close, merge or become public by 1973.

If massive federal support were to be the polarizing lodestone of ALL educational institutions, we would create an educational network dependent primarily on federal largess and for this reason responding with Pavlovian regularity to the requirements of a super office of education in Washington that would hold the purse strings.

Our American society has some basic and difficult decisions to make about the desirability of our dual educational system and the preservation of private enterprise. In this connection our citizens might ask themselves, "Do I want to be taxed without recourse for all higher education, and have it all under governmental control?" "Do I want to have some choice as to where I distribute some of my money in the form of gifts to be utilized as I see fit?" "Do I want my children to have freedom of choice as to the college they will attend, or see them forced to attend a governmental institution because this is the only type available?" "Do I want to see private enterprise, upon which our country was developed, preserved in education so that it will continue to flourish elsewhere in our society?" "Or have I ceased caring?"

These and many other important questions need clear answers — and quickly. But they lead to only one end — a choice by you and your fellow citizens — whether you wish to make generous and continuing tax-deductible gifts to preserve the independent institutions, or to pay a higher and higher price in tax support for a single governmentally controlled system.

The choice is yours to make!
