Candidates For Student Body President . . .

BOB HANCOCK

1. Registration:
 - a. Elimination of unnecessary delays in registering for courses.
 - b. Elimination of Veterans' line as much as possible.
 - c. Have Student Council members present for students' guide and welfare in assisting student to register.
2. Books:
 - a. Eliminate book line.
 - b. Have necessary books available for students before the first class meeting.
3. Freshman Orientation:
 - a. First three weeks of school will be an instruction period for ALL freshmen in the traditions of the University of Tampa.
 - b. Return freshman initiation to the campus.
 - c. Have freshmen act as freshmen.
4. Parking:
 - a. Secure more parking space.
 - b. Have permanent parking space assigned for each student automobile.
 - c. Issue license plate to identify the automobile as belonging to a student of the University of Tampa. This will eliminate outsiders from parking on our lot.
 - d. Have parking lot attendants during class periods to insure proper parking.
5. Standing Committees:
 - a. Entertainment:
 - (1) Beach parties
 - (2) Dances
 - (3) Outings and picnics
 - (4) Variety programs
 - b. Assembly:
 - (1) To instill interest in assemblies by providing an attractive program.
 - (2) Student assemblies to be voluntary in attendance.
 - c. Athletic:
 - (1) To be responsible for sale of high school and college tickets to games to be played in Tampa.
 - (2) To be responsible for PEP RALLIES with cooperation of the University of Tampa Cheerleaders.

- (3) To be responsible for a suitable seating arrangement of the University of Tampa students at the Spartan games.
- (4) To assist all athletes whenever possible in regards to books, supplies and employment.
- d. Decorating:
 - (1) To be in charge of ALL decorating on the grounds of the University of Tampa. (Organizations will first contact this committee to learn what is and what is not permissible in decorations as set forth by the Administration.)
 - (2) Will be responsible for the removal of all decorations after a function is over.
- e. Charity drives:
 - (1) To be responsible for the organizing the University of Tampa student body for the drives.
 - (2) Shall be custodians of the funds collected until the agencies call for them.
 - (3) Promote and make each drive a success.
- f. Publicity:
 - (1) To insure each function of the organizations at the University of Tampa receive the proper credit and attention due it.
 - (2) Whenever practical, work in conjunction with each organization at the University of Tampa in publicizing the functions of that organization.

- g. Organization.
 - (3) Insure that each student of the University of Tampa is informed on the activities of the student government administration.
 6. Office Hours:
 - a. Have regularly scheduled office hours in order that each student might, at his convenience, be able to visit the office.
 - b. Office will not be used for a social parlor, but a student may feel free to call at any time with a complaint, suggestions, ideas, problems, or comments on the student government administration policies.
 7. Establishment of a "President's Round Table:"
 - a. To be composed of each president of each organization, whether it be Greek, honorary or social, for the sole purpose to keep harmony between all the organizations.
 - b. To insure there will be no social calendar conflicts and to avoid overloading any one weekend with activities.
 - c. To discuss problems of each organization and to offer solutions whenever possible.
- The above points are, in my opinion, vital to every student at the University of Tampa. If, during my term of office, there shall be a need for a change in policy,

it shall be done only with the approval of the student council or upon demand by the student body. The above statements shall be added to as the need arises or is brought to my attention.

It is my solemn promise to the student body of the University of Tampa, that, as president of the student body, I shall not allow any personal feelings that I may have guide me in any matter that is brought to my attention. I shall work diligently for each student, individually and as a group during my term of office. I firmly believe that this office is a full-time job, and that it should be treated as such. I do not believe the president should discharge his duties, either by absentee or proxy. The duties of my personal life shall in no way conflict with the duties of president, as I intend to put forth a full day's work six days a week in behalf of the student body. In doing so, I shall carry out the slogan I have chosen for this campaign, "SERVICE BEFORE SELF."

TONY IPPOLITO

Tony is president of the Pan Hellenic Council and is also a fraternity president. Here is his platform:

1. Closer relations and better understanding between faculty and students.
2. Closer relations and understanding between the Board of Trustees and students.
3. Long-range advertising and publicity for the University of Tampa.
4. Encourage more school spirit and interest in University activities.
5. Encourage more independents to participate in intramural and social activities.
6. Encourage high school graduates to attend the University of Tampa.
7. Bill board placed on northern entrance to city advertising the University of Tampa and reading "Tampa—Home of the University of Tampa."
8. Continue and participate more in events and activities between the University of Tampa and other Florida colleges.
