



# WHY STUDY ABROAD?


The American Institute for Foreign Study (AIFS) conducted a study of 1600 AIFS study abroad alumni and reported the following:

# **COSTA RICA**

# BIO 205 TROPICAL BIOLOGY AND CONSERVATION

This course is intended for students interested in the natural history, biology and ecology of the tropics, the most biologically diverse region of the world. Students will study evolutionary, ecological and other biological principles of tropical ecosystems and the natural history of the organisms that live there. We will examine conservation programs, sustainable development practices and the widespread impact of this region of the globe. The course culminates in a two-week travel experience where students will visit such places as lowland tropical rain forests, high elevation tropical cloud forests, coastal ecosystems, primary and secondary forests and more. In the field, students will conduct brief research programs designed to illustrate the possibilities of careers working in the tropics over a broad range of biological specialties, ranging from tropical biodiversity, evolution and sustainability to agriculture and medicine.

#### **About the Professor**



Dr. Lori McRae is an Associate Professor in the Biology Department at the University of Tampa. She earned a Bachelors of Science Degree in Marine Science/Biology from the University of Tampa and a Ph.D. in Zoology from Louisiana State University. For her graduate work, she studied migratory fishes in the Hawaiian Islands and continued that work while teaching at UT. She currently studies estuarine fishes and invasive species in Florida, while teaching a variety of courses including Ichthyology, Vertebrate Zoology, and Marine Invertebrate Zoology. She also enjoys field trips and field work with students, including trips around the state of Florida and study abroad experiences.

# BIO 401 AN ORIGIN OF SPECIES: DARWIN'S LONDON

The nature and biodiversity of the United Kingdom were on display throughout Charles Darwin's youth, stimulating the obsession that would eventually give rise to the single most important discovery in biology. "On the Origin of Species: Darwin's London" is a Spring semester course with Summer 2 study abroad program to London. It places you in many of the same surroundings that inspired Darwin to pursue his passion for biology that led to the discovery of evolution by natural selection, changing the world forever! In London, we will visit iconic and eminent institutions that helped set Darwin on the path to discovery and continue their discoveries to this day! With visits to the Zoological Society of London, London's Museum of Natural History, Kew Royal Botanical Gardens, Charles Darwin's home and more, we will learn about topics ranging from natural selection and evolution to paleontology, the history of biology, and the vertebrate diversity of the U.K. Students will become immersed in British culture and learn how Victorian society promoted scientific discovery, and how some of those values continue to do so today.

#### **About the Professor**

Dr. Mason Meers attended Indiana University and The Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, where he earned his doctorate in Functional Anatomy & Evolution studying the evolution of crocodilians. Today he is recognized as a leading authority on reptile evolution and conducts research on a broad array of evolutionary topics from extinct fossil vertebrates to evolutionary medicine. His research has been featured on the National Geographic channel and in newspapers around the world. He has also served as a consultant on documentaries about evolution. A collections-based scientist, Dr. Meers has conducted research at London's famed Museum of Natural History since the late 1990's, studying specimens ranging from 200 million year old fossil crocodiles to living reptiles. Having traveled extensively, Dr. Meers has led study abroad courses to countries around the world.

# FRANCE & BELGIUM

# BIO 407 FERMENTION MICROBIOLOGY

Fermented Foods: From Art to Science will explore both the history and present-day industries of fermented foods. Students will discover the applications of fermentation microbiology in this important industry through required international travel and visits to food producers in France and Belgium. We will also visit the Pasteur Museum in Paris, which will allow the students to see first-hand the famous instruments that Louis Pasteur used to discover the role that microbes play in fermentation. This travel course is the companion course to BIO407: Fermentation Microbiology, in which students will learn about the microbial species used in different food fermentations, metabolic activities of microorganisms and their influence on product characteristics, microbial interactions, processing of fermented foods, industrial applications of microbiology, and problems that may arise during fermentation.



#### **About the Professor**

Eric Freundt has been teaching at UT since 2011 and came to UT because he loves teaching and doing research with students. He's originally from Chicago although grew up in Franklin, Tennessee, which is just south of Nashville, and attended Middle Tennessee State University, where he majored in Biology. Professor Freundt loved microbiology courses and got involved in research through the Honors program. The research was in virology where he became fascinated with virus-host interactions and decided to pursue a Ph.D. in viral pathogenesis. For grad school, he went to Oxford University as part of the Oxford-NIH partnership program and studied the accessory proteins of the SARS coronavirus. After that, he did a postdoc at Stanford University where he studied a couple topics - a virus that causes MS-like disease in mice as well as how proteins can spread like viruses in the central nervous system in diseases such as Parkinson's. He enjoys spending time with his wife, Ellie, and two sons, Emerson (11 yo) and Ethan (9 yo). He also tries to be outdoors as much as possible running, biking, swimming, hiking, skiing, etc.

# EDU 495 CIVIL SOCIETY AND MIGRANTS' RIGHTS

This experiential learning program is designed to introduce learners to the topic of civil society and migrants' rights in Tunisia. The program includes a range of active educational and cultural experiences during 10-days of travel. Learners will participate in guest lectures, site visits, and excursions. Topics that will be included in the program are the history of migration, the Mediterranean and global politics, the Tunisian civil society and their efforts related to immigrant education and integration, and others. Cultural activities and excursions include: a tour of Carthage (Tunisia), walking tour of Sidi Bou Said, visit to the Kairouan (a UNESCO World Heritage site and home of The Great Mosque), travels to Mahdia (a coastal city) and a tour of El Jem Amphitheater (a UNESCO World Heritage site), among others. Learners will earn credits by enrolling in a 4-credit hour course: EDU495 Civil Society and Migrants' Rights during May Term 2022.



#### **About the Professor**

Dr. Enilda Romero-Hall is an Associate Professor in the Department of Education at The University of Tampa. She is also the Graduate Coordinator of the Instructional Design and Technology program. Dr. Enilda Romero-Hall is fluent in both English and Spanish. She has served as program director for a UT travel course to Switzerland titled: "Innovation in Teaching and Learning in Switzerland." Additionally, she has extensive experience living (Panama and Canada) and traveling abroad. Dr. Romero-Hall was a participant in three international faculty development programs (to Turkey, Spain, and Tunisia) and a faculty exchange program (to Switzerland), which were extremely relevant to her role as program coordinator for an experiential education abroad program. # ENS 122 GLOBAL SUSTAINABILITY

Sustainability matters for every person on planet Earth. As the human population and the global economy grows, finding sustainable ways to utilize natural resources becomes increasingly vital. In this course, students will learn about modern issues in sustainability by studying successes, failures, and future opportunities for sustainability around the world. In Tampa, students will explore local issues in sustainability through a series of guided field trips and open discussions. Local topics will then be compared to international examples to see how the problems and solutions vary in different localities. The course will culminate by traveling to and exploring the beautiful island nation of Fiji, where students can see how sustainability is managed on a remote island in the tropical Pacific. Fiji, known for its friendly people and breathtaking tropical scenery, serves as an excellent location for studying international issues in sustainability. Topics covered include water supplies, agriculture, fisheries, sustainable tourism, ecology, energy production, and wildlife refuges.

#### **About the Professor**

Dr. Michael Middlebrooks is an assistant professor of Biology at the University of Tampa. He is an invertebrate zoologist, underwater photographer, enthusiastic traveler, and a passionate explorer of the planet's wildlife and biodiversity. Dr. Middlebrooks conducts research on photosynthetic sea slugs in the Caribbean and has spent extensive time scuba diving and traveling in Southeast Asia, the South Pacific, and the Red Sea. He became a scuba instructor as an undergraduate student and today teaches Invertebrate Zoology, Marine Invertebrate Zoology, and Global Sustainability at the University of Tampa. Dr. Middlebrooks has traveled with students to a variety of international locations for courses and research including Australia, the Bahamas, Curacao, Dominica, and the Dominican Republic.

# **NEW ZEALAND**

# ESC 391 ENVIRONMENTAL EXERCISE, PHYSIOLOGY, AND OUTDOOR EDUCATION

This travel course will consist of two parts:

(1) review exercise physiology in different environments; (2) focus on physical activity, human performance and outdoor education, within the New Zealand landscape. The students will also experience local tourist activities as well as a comfortable level of immersion into the New Zealand culture. Students will explore physical activity from a variety of paradigms (recreation, sport, exercise science and health), delving into international perspective, practices, and cultural frame. Development or refinement of core knowledge in the physical activity domain as it relates to application of scientific principles, authentic experiences, personal development, health, and professional practice. Travel component includes outdoor activities and students are expected to be healthy to fully participate. This course consist of seven weeks of lectures/meetings at UT during second part of spring semester and two weeks traveling to New Zealand in May. If you like outdoor adventures, you would like to learn more about them and discover New Zealand at the same time — this is the course for you!

#### About the Professor



Dr. Nauris Tamulevicius has extensive international experience. He believes that learning and respecting other cultures is an essential component of modern education. Dr. T grew up in Lithuania, speaks five languages and has multiple hobbies related to outdoor activities (mountaineering, fishing, kayaking, biking, tennis, etc.). # **THAILAND**

# HSC 401 INTERPROFESSIONAL GLOBAL HEALTH AND SCIENCE

Students will travel to the beautiful city of Chiang Mai, Thailand. They will visit the city's most important temples and markets, while learning about and applying community health promotion and disease prevention concepts. The travel component of the course will include two weeks in Thailand with guided interactive tours covering the history, culture, healthcare, and public health trends of the country. In addition, students will visit the local humane Elephant Sanctuary to learn about Thailand's elephant population, experience Thai cooking classes to learn about the cuisine and nutrition of the region, go hiking to visit hill-top villages and have two free days for exploration and play. A few of the local recommendations for exploration and play include ziplining excursions, trekking to hilltribes, visiting a local waterfall and a trip to the white temple in Chiang Rai. As a community health practicum, the service learning component will be held in the Doi Suthep-Pui National Park in a small hill-tribe village on the mountains. This experience will provide the students with opportunities to practice concepts of health promotion/disease prevention through community education activities.

# **COSTA RICA**

#### NUR 392 TRANSCULTURAL HEALTHCARE IN LATIN AMERICA

This travel course is comprised of two parts. The first part (NUR 392) takes place in the classroom and focuses on the preparation of nursing and public health students regarding the practices of healthcare in Latin America. The students will be introduced to the Latin American cultural considerations as well as the major health issues of concern. Additionally, students will be exposed to concepts of the expected professional behavior and barriers to transcultural care of healthcare. The second part (NUR 392A) allows students to travel to Costa Rica to apply community health promotion and disease prevention concepts in a transcultural environment. The eleven-day travel component of the course includes guided tours covering the culture and history of the country. Three days are spent in the urban center of San Jose learning about the differences between public and private healthcare. The next week is spent in the rural/rainforest areas of Monteverde as an immersion homestay experience. Here, students have the ability to interact closely with the local people in the region. This is a community health practicum including patient care, health promotion, disease prevention, and community education activities.

Dr. Tressa Pedroff has over 25 years of clinical experience in the care of adults and older adults in the trauma/critical care setting. Areas of academic interest center on helping students to understand the specific needs of adult/older populations in the acute care setting. Additionally, she specializes in care of culturally diverse geriatrics in the community, including palliative and end-of-life care treatment options. Her research interests focus on palliative care, international travel abroad and the implementation of effective teaching strategies to improve student learning of difficult nursing concepts and clinical reasoning. Dr. Pedroff seeks to promote cultural competence and a greater global presence by leading international nursing travel courses to Latin America. She has traveled to Costa Rica annually with students for close to decade.

#### PSC 282 DEVELOPMENT STRATEGIES & PROJECTS IN AFRICA

For most the highlight of our trip is the week spent in rural farming communities of Nabdam. Here students attune themselves to the daily rhythms of village life while implementing student and community designed development projects. Your life will be changed as you learn about the struggles of the world's poor and how to responsibly help your fellow man. Through this course, students design and implement small-scale development projects in the rural community of Nangodi.

# SPE 208 SPEECH FOR BUSINESS

This course is intended to introduce students to communication, business communication, and other issues commonly encountered in business and professional situations particularly in foreign cultures. In order to prepare students for communicating and conducting business in a non-western culture, students will learn about the history of Singapore while analyzing the social issues that this country faces in the 21st century. Additionally, this course focuses on fundamental communication and stylistic differences between Western and Non-Western cultures to include: non-verbal and verbal communication, high vs. low context cultures, and generally how cultural differences can impact business and relations. Students will also develop their own advanced public speaking skills through professional presentations and class activities prior to departure.

While anyone could benefit from such a course, this academic endeavor may be of particular interest to those currently studying communication, journalism, business, international business, consulting, public relations, interested in social media, or anyone with aspirations to enroll in advanced level public speaking and communication courses.
