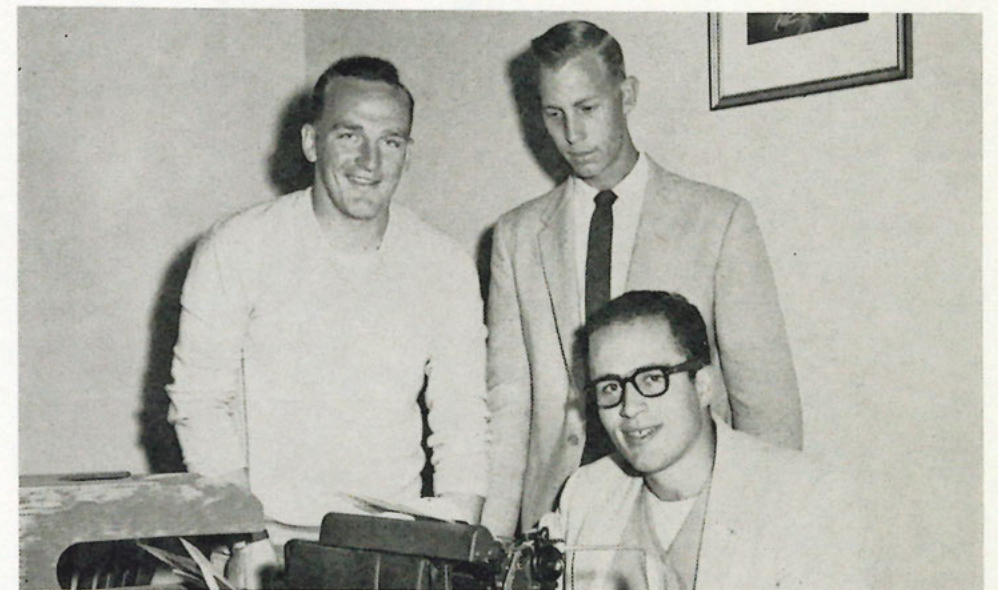

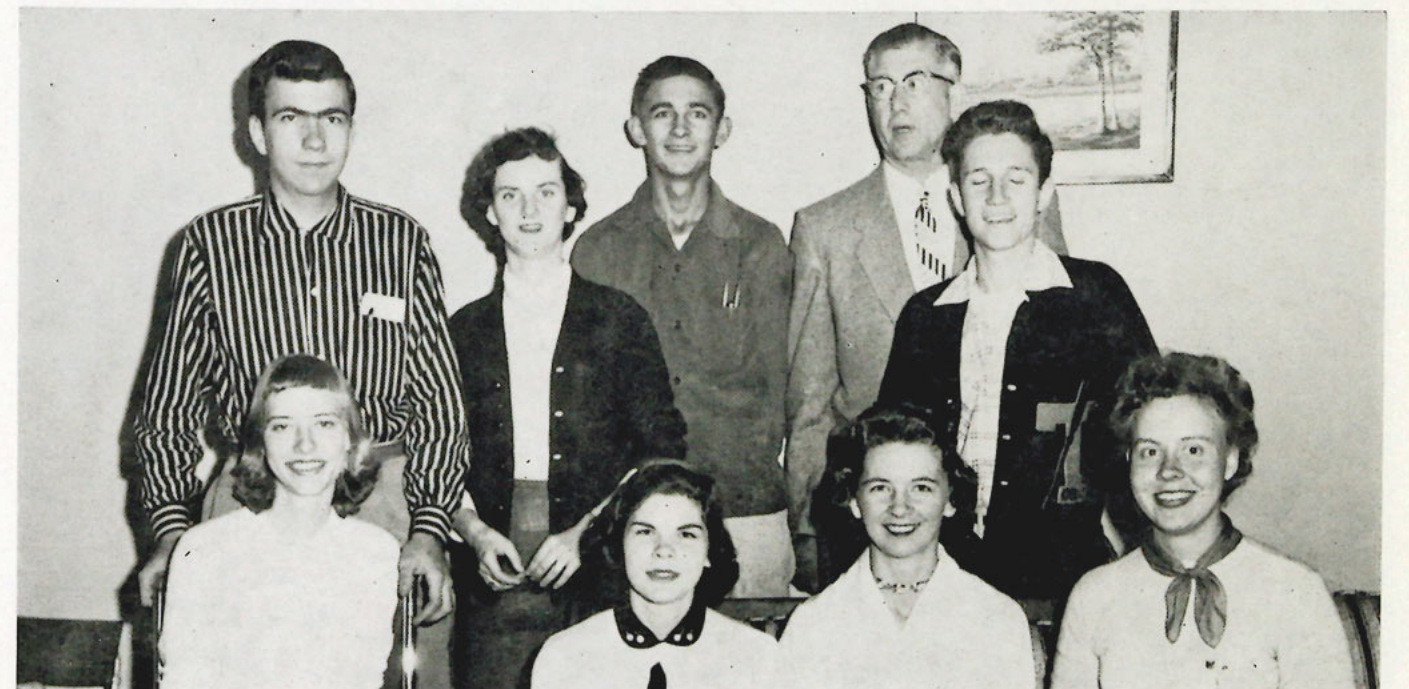
The Newman Club offers religious, social and education activities for Catholic students on the Tampa campus. Through this group the Catholic students coordinate their religious life with their college life.

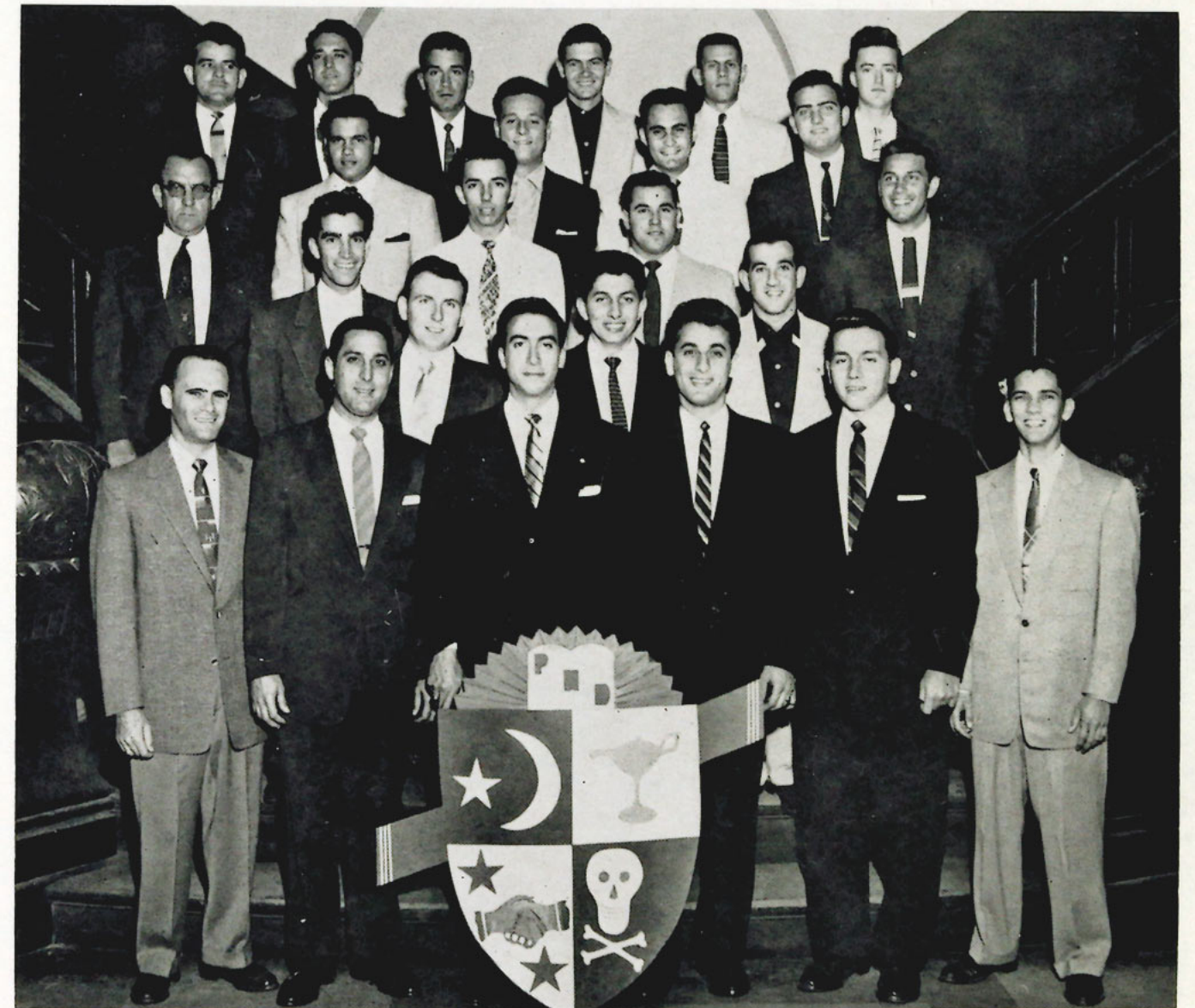

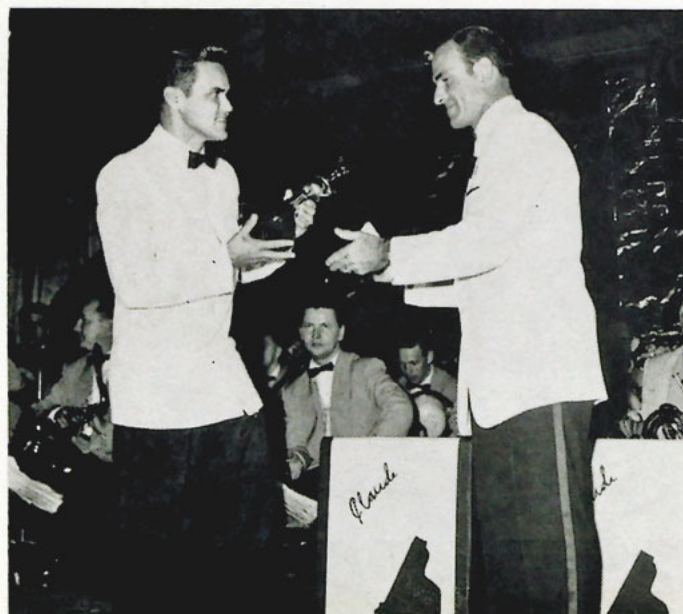


MISS MARTHA THRAILKILL, Teke choice for Homecoming Queen.

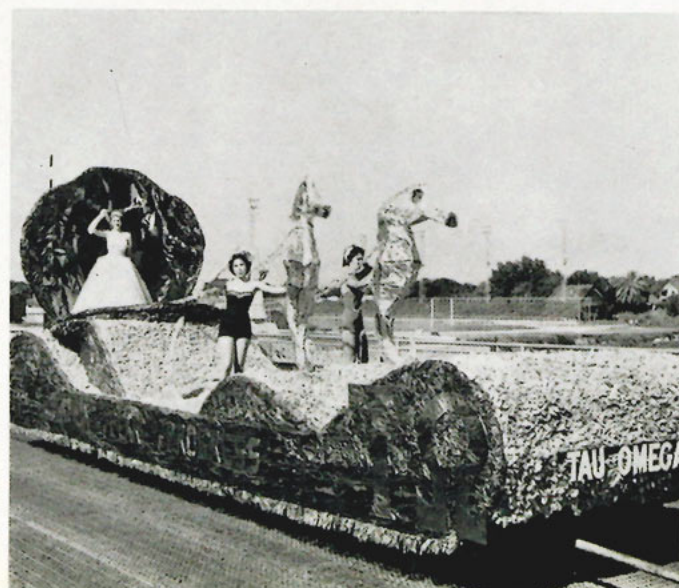

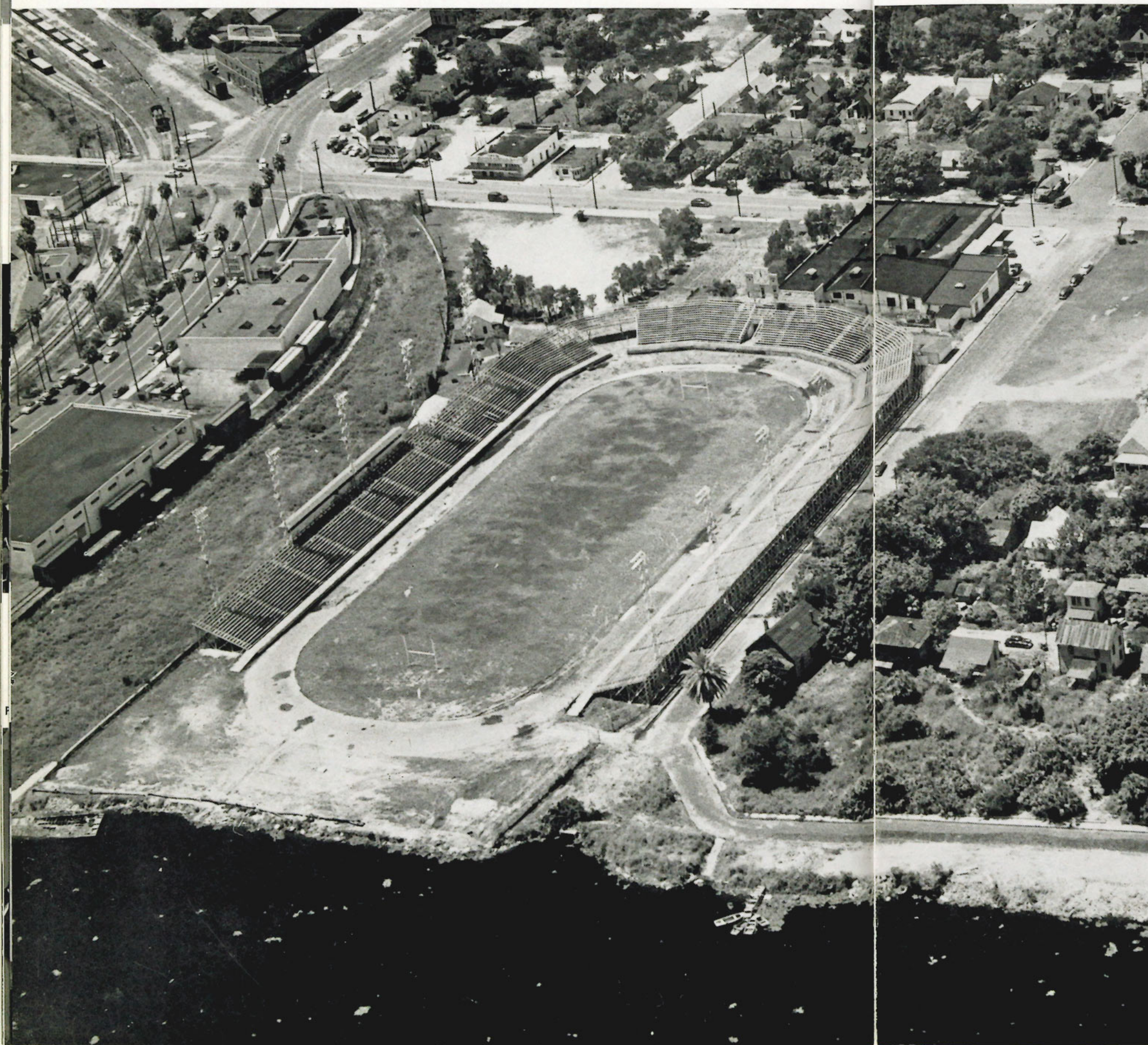

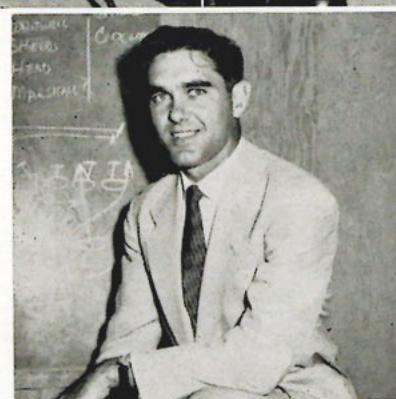

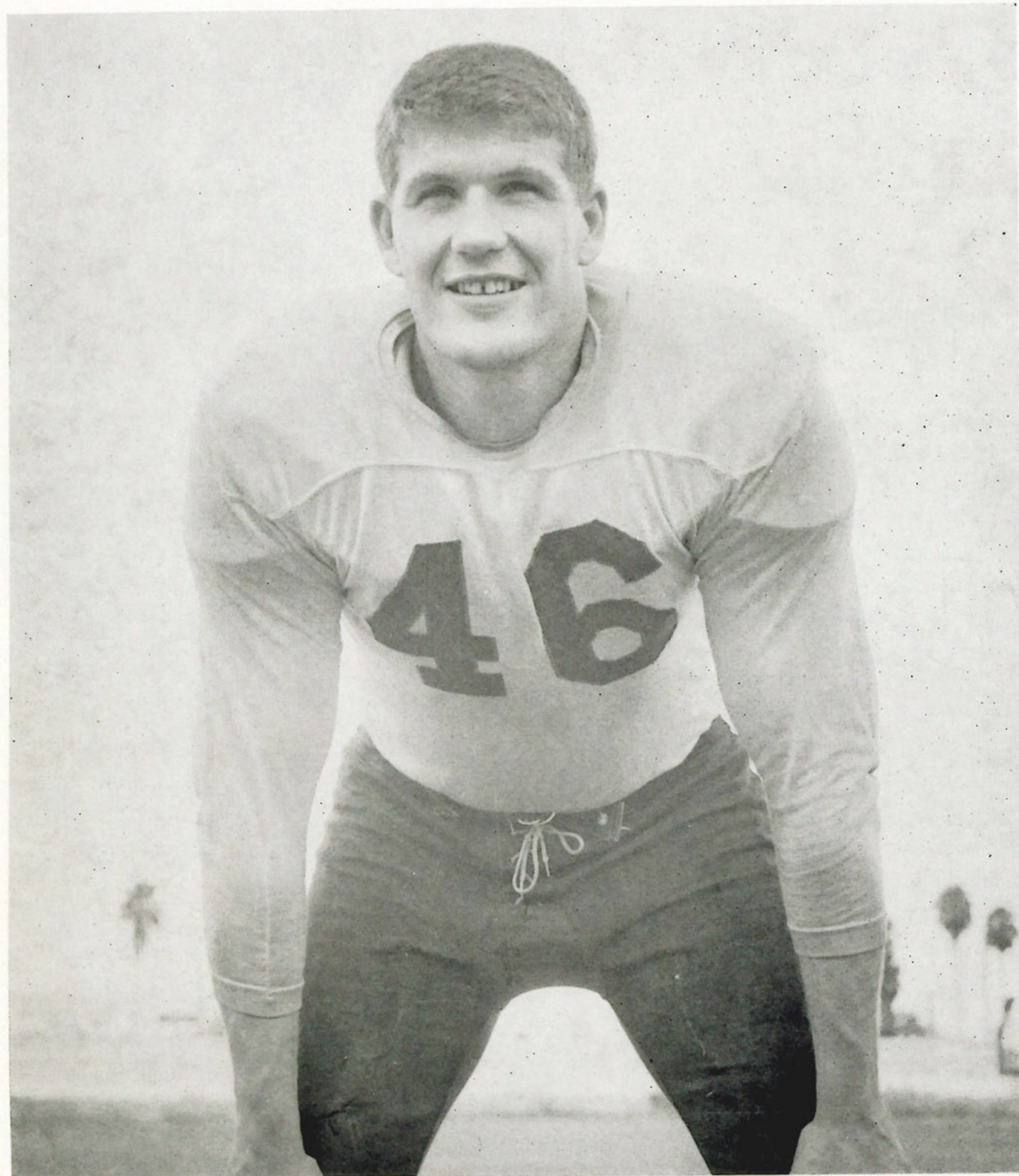
The Spartans, with a 2-1 record after three starts,

The male chorus provides music especially arranged for male voices.

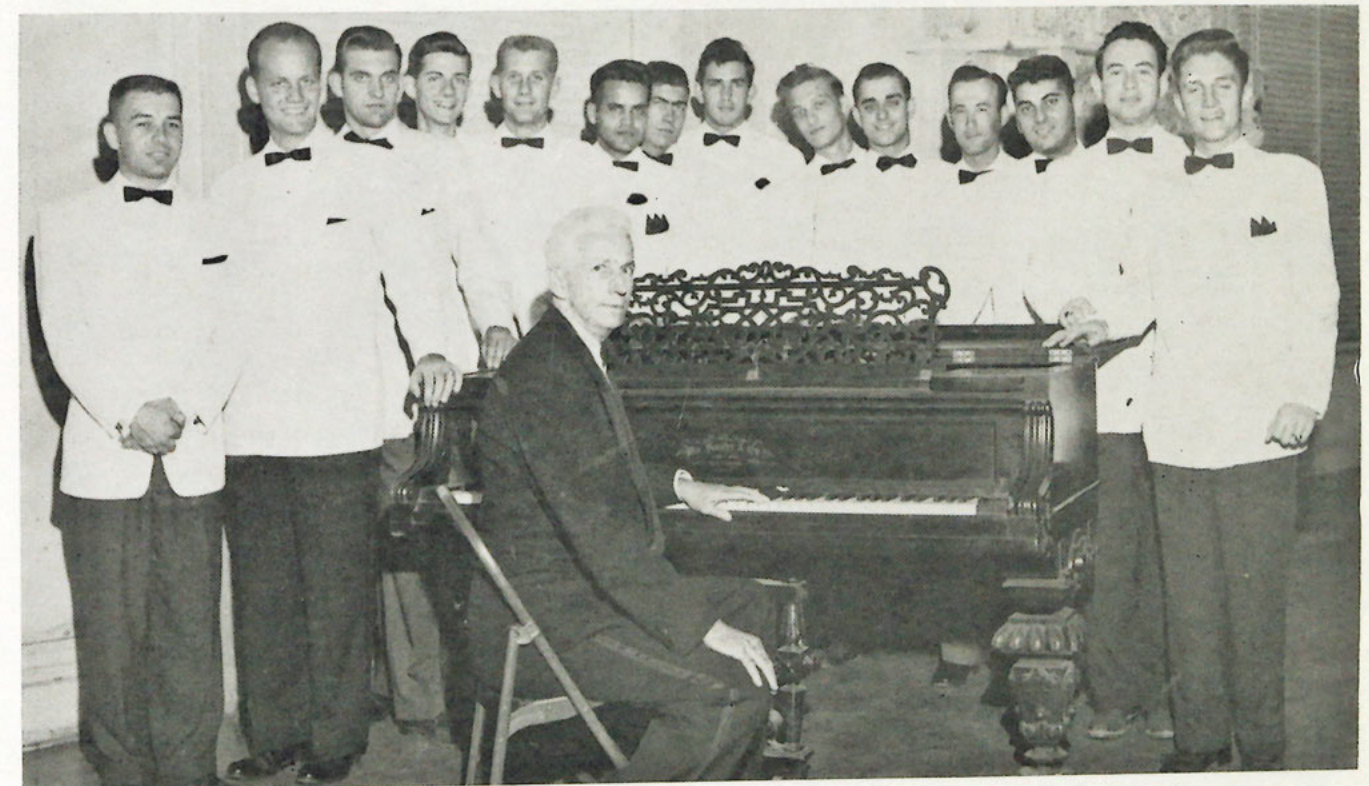

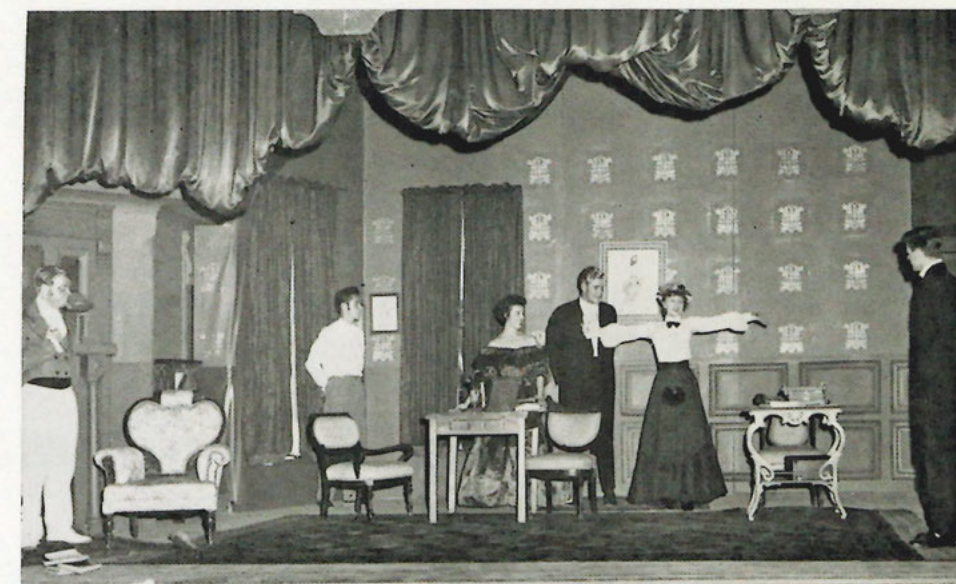
