### UT Names First Woman Vice President

(OPI) — The University of Tampa named its first woman vice president with the appointment of Marisol Johns, formerly dean of student development, to the position of vice president and dean of students.

UT President B.D. Owens said Mrs. Johns will succeed Dr. Charles West, vice president for student affairs, who resigned effective June 30 due to family interests in Mississippi and Arkansas.

Mrs. Johns, wife of TECO controller Howard Johns, is a native of Cuba, daughter of a physician and a graduate of the University of Tampa. She has a masters degree in counseling from the University of South Florida.

For Mrs. Johns, the promotion is a new peak in a multitude of careers: piano teacher, concert pianist, Cuban Airlines chief dispatcher and interpreter, modern languages teacher and department head at Academy of Holy Names, counselor at USF and dean of women and dean of student development at UT.

Mrs. Johns' role with students as counselor, "mother" and at times disciplinarian or bail bondsman, is a 24-hour job. She is listed in Who's Who in American Women, Outstanding Educators of America and Leaders in Education.

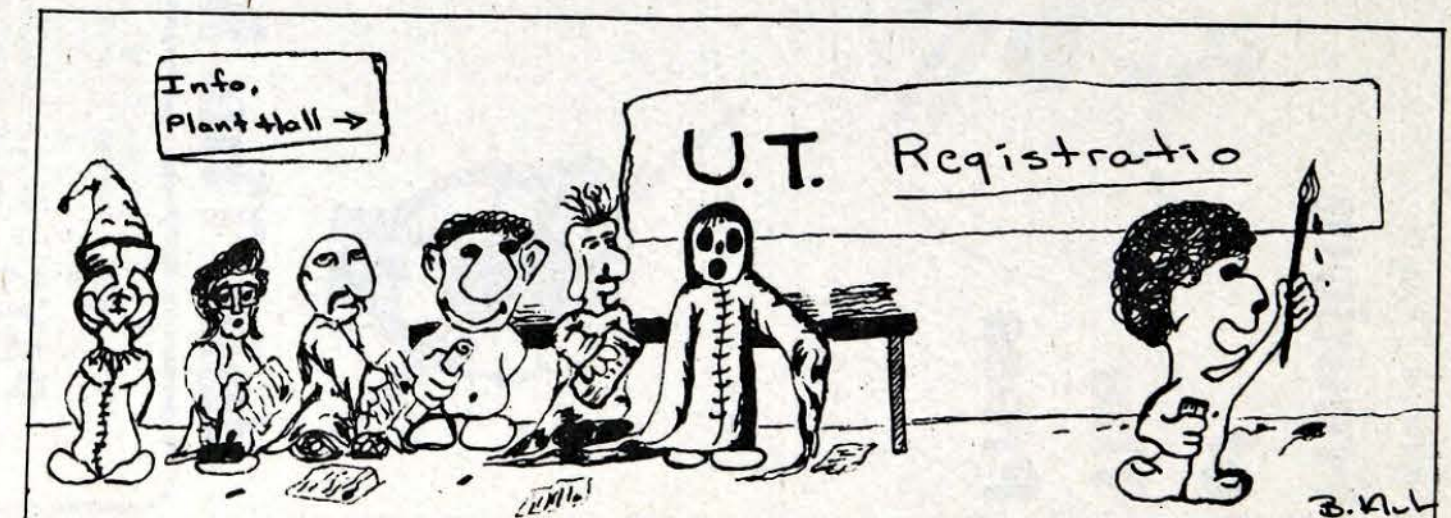
### Birrenkott Appointed Athletic Director

(OPI) — Robert Birrenkott, assistant professor of physical education at the University of Tampa for the past two years, has been named director of intramurals and intercollegiate athletics at the Spartan college.

Prof. Birrenkott will retain his faculty appointment and will be assisted in his duties by Tom Feaster, coordinator of intercollegiate sports, and David Jackson, director of activities, organizations and recreation.

A native of Lemmon, S.D., Birrenkott earned a B.S. degree in physical education from Black Hills State College, Spearfish, S.D., and an M.S. degree in physical education from Eastern New Mexico University, Portales, N.M. He just received his Ph. D in health, physical education and recreation from the University of Mississippi.

Before coming to the University of Tampa, Birrenkott taught as a graduate instructor at the University of Mississippi, served on the Intramural Appeals Council, and was play-by-play announcer for the Ole Miss Rebel baseball network. He spent the summers of 1964-72 as a marina manager and fishing guide at Yellowstone National Park, Wyoming, and he served as assistant director of intramurals as well as graduate assistant in physical education at Eastern New Mexico University from 1969-71.



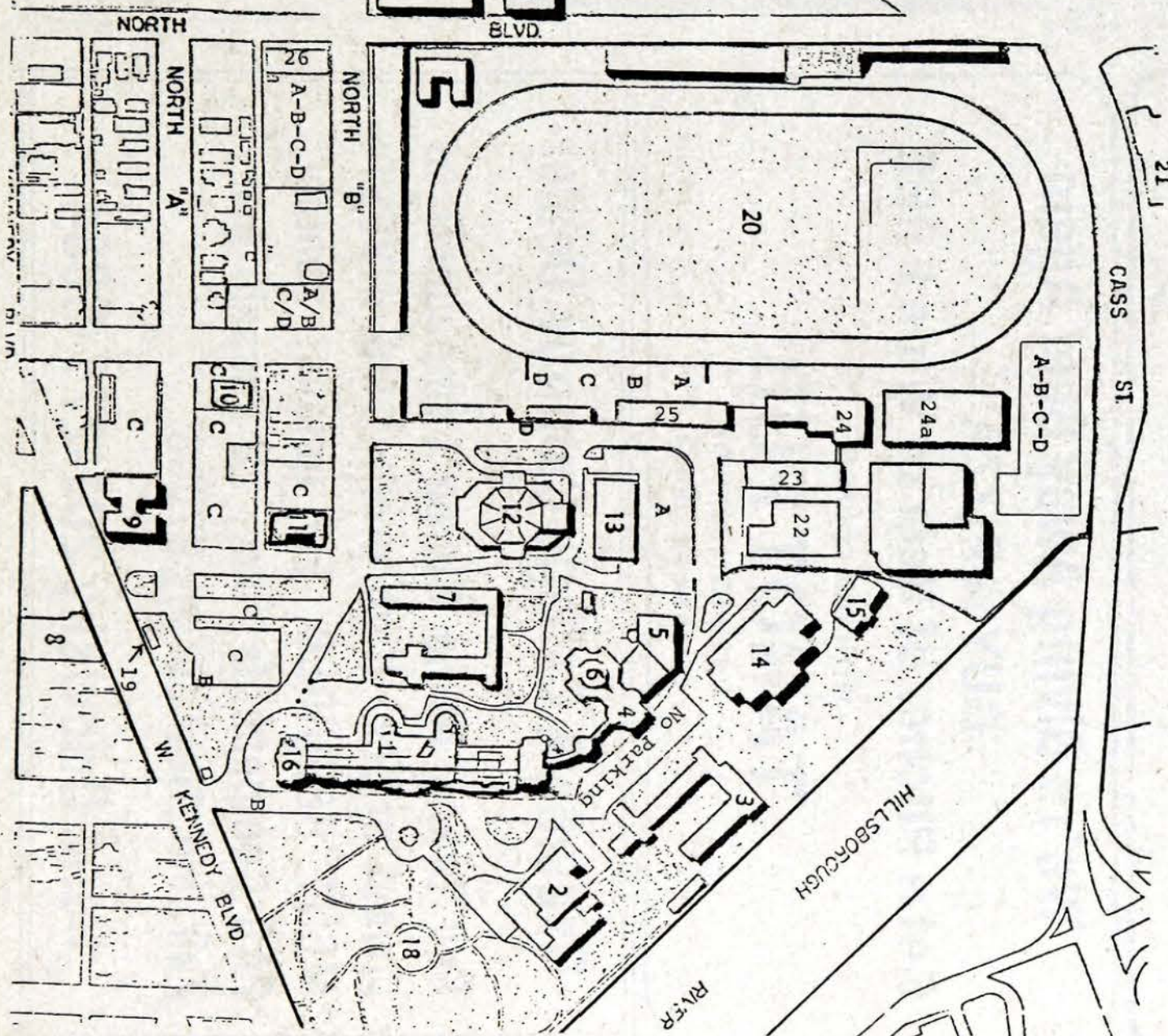
